

GEORGE BURROUGHS (BURROWS, BURRAS)--Born ca 1758-60 Halifax Co, VA, died 15 Apr 1818 Halifax Co, VA; married 15 Sept 1784 Halifax, VA, Jean Scates who died 2 Apr 1847 Rockingham Co, NC. She was dau of William Scates who bequeathed property to Jean Burras in his will in 1805.

As a resident of Halifax Co, VA, George Burroughs enlisted about the spring of 1776 under Lt Edward Wade and was made sergeant and served in the company of Capt Nathaniel Cocke in the 7th Virginia Regiment for two years until the spring of 1778 when he was appointed Commissary of Subsistence and served as such and as Quartermaster to Col Weedon's Regiment under Gen Greene for at least two years, when he resigned his commission and returned to Halifax Co.

After the war, George Burroughs moved to Rockingham Co, NC for several years before moving back to Halifax Co, VA. Jeremiah Scales testified that George Burroughs lived while a resident of Rockingham Co on the waters of Buffalo Island Creek and also on the waters of Matrimony Creek at Gates Old Field near the Virginia line. While living in Virginia, he lived near Booker's Ferry on the Staunton River.

After the death of her husband, Jean Burroughs and her family moved back to Rockingham Co, NC.

On 27 Feb 1854, Richard H. Scales of Rockingham County, Administrator of the estate of Jean Burroughs, applied for a pension or a settlement from the government on the Revolutionary service of George Burroughs on behalf of Mary Burroughs Curry, the only child of the couple living at that time. ARCHIBALD CARMICHAEL--Born ca 1754 Lanark, Scotland, died ca 1829 Surry Co, NC; md in NC (1) Elizabeth Nix, born ca 1755 Scotland (2) Sally ?.

As a resident of Caswell Co, NC during the Revolutionary War, Archibald Carmichael was a volunteer in the NC Army and served seven years as a private.

(NC Revolutionary Army Accts. Vol IV, page 90, Folio 2 - Accounts Comptrollers Office 1777-1783, page 53; NC STATE RECORDS, Vol 16, page 619, 1782-3)

By 1808 Archibald Carmichael had bought land from Michael Teague in Surry Co, NC where his will is recorded in Vol 4, pp 15-16, dated 17 Mar 1827 and probated 1829, when his heirs sold the land and removed to Indiana in Sept with other relatives, as stated in RECORDS OF THE MORAVIANS IN NC, Vol 8, pp 3893 and 3895.

The history and some anecdotes of his service are recorded in a family Bible in the possession of his grandson, Constant Joseph Carmichael (born 22 Aug 1833), whose auto-biography clarifies that Elizabeth Nix was the mother of all his children:

1--Starling Carmichael, born 1780 probably Halifax Co, VA, died 1850 Monroe Co, IN; married 12 May 1801 Stokes Co, NC Martha Long (dau of Israel Long), born 1780 NC, died 1864 IN; 12 children.

2--Jane Carmichael, born 1783 VA, died 1868 Greene Co, IN; married 1 Apr 1824 Surry Co, NC John Miller; at least 3 children.

3--Richard Carmichael, born 4 Feb 1785 Caswell Co, NC, died 7 Nov 1870 Clinton Co, IN where he'd gone to live with his children after his wife's death; married 26 June 1812 Surry Co, NC Mary "Polly" Graves (dau of Peter Graves), born 24 Aug 1787 NC, died 11 May 1863 Monroe Co, IN; 10 children.

4--Sarah Carmichael, born 1788 NC, died 1841 Greene Co, IN; married (1) 15 May 1811 Surry Co, NC Peter Graves (son of Peter Graves); died 1814 in War of 1812; 2 children; married (2) William Martindale.

5--Alexander Carmichael, born 21 Dec 1791 NC, died 15 Apr 1865 Monroe Co, IN; md (1) 28 Aug 1812 Stokes Co, NC Mary Ann Holder (dau of Charles Holder), born 4 Oct 1794 Stokes Co, NC, died 1834 Monroe Co, IN; 9 children; (2) 23 Apr 1837 Jane (widow of John Evans), born 1800, died 1863; 3 children.

6--Joseph Carmichael, born 3 Apr 1796 NC, died 22 Jan 1839 Monroe Co, IN; md. 27 July 1818 Stokes Co, NC Elizabeth Holder (dau of Charles Holder), born 22 Nov 1797 Stokes Co, died 29 Nov 1867 Greene Co, IN; 11 children.

7--Archibald Carmichael, born 23 Nov 1801 NC, died Pickering, Nodaway Co, MO; md 2 Aug 1824 Surry Co, NC Martha Pennington (dau of Joseph Pennington), born 27 Jan 1803 NC; 9 children. [www.virginiapioneers.com](http://www.virginiapioneers.com)

8--Elizabeth Carmichael, born ca 1802 NC, died May 1835 Owen Co, IN; md 17 July 1820 Surry Co, NC John Adam Fulk, son of John and grandson of Andreas, born 29 Apr 1795, died Sept 1851; 7 children.

**JR**  
**DUNCAN CARMICHAEL**--Born 11 May 1755 by tradition in Scotland, an immigrant with his father and family at age fourteen; died 3 July 1834 Stokes Co, NC; married Charity, probably dau of Charles Witt and Lamina Harbour, about 1774, who had died by Sept 1821. (Stokes Co Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions minutes: 13 Sept 1821 - 8 Dec 1834; National Archives S 41467)

Duncan Carmichael is recorded in Caswell Co, NC when a deed ordering the county surveyor to lay out for him 300 acres on the waters of Shaw's Mill Creek, join the Virginia line, including the improvements of Duncan Carmichael Sr and of Richard Smithwick, dated 12 June 1778. He enlisted May 1781 in 2nd Regiment, NC Line, commanded by Col Henry Dixon in Capt Tillman (Tilghman) Dixon's Company, serving as a blacksmith during the battles of Eutaw Springs and the Siege of Ninety-Six in SC, discharged June 178- (illegible). Other documents indicate he continued as a blacksmith and farmer all his life.

His pension application in Stokes Co, NC includes an inventory of his property and his sworn statement that he is no longer able to work as a blacksmith, due to pain in his right elbow and that he lives with his widowed daughter, Mary Ingram, who works to support her five children, his other children having left



him long ago.

His death is recorded in the same court with the appointment of his son Barzillia, as guardian for the other heirs, "leaving no widow, but leaving the following children":

**SON OF DUNCAN JR.**

1--John Carmichael, born ca 1774 VA (probably Halifax Co where he lived his adult life), md (1) Elizabeth Dodson, 5 children born 1800-1825; (2) 17 Jan 1861 Halifax Co Nancy McComack Richardson, a widow. In 1850 Census he was 78 years old, living with his dau, Susan; in 1860 Census he was 86, living with his dau Nancy and son-in-law, Meades Jones. In 1861 he was listed as 87 on his marriage license application and his bride as 30.

2--Sarah Carmichael married 18 Nov 1798 Caswell Co, NC John Smithey.

3--Leminah Carmichael married 9 Nov 1799 Caswell Co, NC, Thomas Climer.

4--William Carmichael, born ca 1780 NC, md 25 Oct 1799 Sallie Smith, 5 or 8 children; had removed to GA, but returned to marry 1 June 1818 in Caswell Co Elizabeth Williams, 10 children; died 5 Oct 1846 Monroe Co, GA. (SAR)

5--Lemuel Carmichael md 19 Aug 1804 Stokes Co, NC Suzy Carmichael; removed to TN; estate records no children.

6--Mary Carmichael, born ca 1785, md 18 Mar 1805 Caswell Co, NC, Vench Ingram, whose orphans are named in the April term, 1812 Court in Caswell Co.

7--Barzillai Carmichael, born ca 1792 NC, md (1) 6 Mar 1811 Stokes Co, NC Mary Westmoreland, 7 children; md (2) 28 Aug 1859 Minerva Boles, 4 children; died ca 1872 Forsyth Co, NC.

8--Solomon Carmichael, born 27 June 1794 NC, md (1) 15 Feb 1812 Stokes Co, NC Sarah Grubbs, 11 children; md (2) 12 Sept 1841 Greene Co, IN, Elizabeth Redmiller, widow of Oolery Sharr, 1 child; died 10 Jan 1883 Greene Co, IN, where he had gone Sept 1829 with the children of Revolutionary soldier, Archibald Carmichael, and their in-laws.

9--Richard Carmichael, born 7 Sept 1796 NC; md 3 Apr 1817 Stokes Co, Sarah Westmoreland, where he often appears in the court minutes for jury duty and work done for the county as a master carpenter; 6 children; died 20 Oct 1865 Forsyth Co, NC.

JOHN FENDALL CARR--Born 20 Nov 1764 Albemarle Co, Va, died 2 Sept 1838 Marshall Co, TN; md 1 Jan 1783 Albemarle Co, Va Elizabeth Dalton (dau of David and Susanna Davis Dalton), born 20 Apr 1768 Albemarle Co, VA, died in 1840's probably Maury Co, TN.

As a resident of Albemarle Co, Va, John Fendall Carr entered service in the Revolutionary War the latter part of 1780 when he was pressed into service with his wagon and team to move prisoners from Albemarle Barrack to Fredericktown, Maryland. Later in the winter, he was sent to Philadelphia for public stores (kettles, sugar, coffee, medicine, etc.)

He entered the army of the Marquis de Lafayette under Col Reuben Lindsey of Albemarle Co, Capt Isaac Davis and Lt Brightheny Brown. His captain became ill and he served under Capt John Burk. They marched to Malvern Hills, about 14
