Camlet -- a kind of rich cloth of Oriental origin supposed to have been made formerly of camel's and silk or other combinations.

He appears prominently on the Rappahannock County court records. By purchase and patent he acquired considerable land in the area which became Richmond County in 1692. It appears from the records he died circa 1685 as at this date Mrs. Margaret Cammack began appearing on the records in a manner she would not if she had been feme covert. The name has been rendered Cammack - Comack - Cammock - Comock &c.

(16??-1715)

She was the widow of *Sylvester Thatcher (16??-1667) by whom she had four children three of whom left issue. In 1709, when she wrote her will, she described herself as "very ancient;" this document makes it certain she had two daughters named Mary - one by each spouse. Naming all her living children, she bequeathed her estate to her three daughters by Warwick Cammack. (See Thatcher genealogical chart, p.268.)
