## MARGARET CAMMACK'S WILL.

In the name of God Amen. I Margaret Cammack being very ancient and weak in Body but of good and perfect Memory thanks be to God and calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this transitory life, and that all flesh must yield into death, Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following revoking and annulling all Wills or Will heretofore by me made and this to be taken only for my last Will.

First: I bequeath my Soul to God and my Body to the Ground to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named, and my Estate which it hath pleased God to lend me, it is my Will and desire that it be divided into three equal parts, the one of which parts I give to my Daughter Margaret Micou. The Second I give to my Daughter Susan Ffoster, and the third it is my will that it shall be divided between my Daughter Mary Starne her son William, and her Son David Starne, and if either of those should die without heirs, then the said estate to fall to the Survivor to have the Whole.

Secondly: And for as much that my two Sons Sylvester Thatcher and John Cammock and my two Daughters Mary Richardson and Elizabeth Deane hath an Estate from their ffather, I give to each one of them one Shilling, the said Shilling to be ye Conclusion of their portion.

Thirdly: I do Constitute and Appoint Mr Paul Micou and Mr John Ffoster to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of March one thousand seven hundred and nine.

p. 91-A. (Note: now we have Francis' identification of the "hatt." Conclusive to say the least. B.F.)

Francis Stern aged about 15 upon his oath saith that the Hatt now produced he verily believes was belonging to M<sup>r</sup> Uriell, which he is induced to believe by reason that he waited upon him when he kept Store at M<sup>rs</sup> Camocks and often brushed the same, and particularly took Notice of its being motheaten under the hat band.

Maden vs Camack Extr Estate 15th 9<sup>ber</sup> 1714. Upon the petition of Fergus Maden against Marg<sup>t</sup> Camock for his Freedome Corne and clothes according to Law, the said Fergus Maden having made oath in Court, that he had rec<sup>d</sup> no more then three barrells of Indian Corne and five yards of ozenbrize in part thereof, Judgment is thereupon granted him against the said Margaret Camock for the sume of thirteene shillings and four pence or the value thereof in goods and a well fixt musketter fusee of the value of twenty shillings and costs als Ex<sup>co</sup> Richmond County, Virginia Records. Court Order Book No. 6. page 274, 6 April 1715.

Maiden Whipt. Whereas Fergus Maiden was by warrant of Nicholas Smith Gent one of the Justices of this Court com<sup>t</sup>ted to the County Goal on suspection of stealing severall things from John Camock and being now brought before his Majestys Justices here present, Upon hearing the evidence of John Camock, Mary Green, Elizabeth Furlong, Paul Micou and Francis Sterne against the said Fergus Maiden and what he had to say in his defence, are of opin-

ion that he is guilty of petty larceny, and it being sufficiently ed he is a person of evill fame. It is thereupon ordered that the forthwith carry him to the Com'on whipping post and give him thirtie lashes on his bair back well laid on, and after haveing soe remain'd him to prison where he shall continue without bail or mai prise untill the next Court, and that he shall have other thirtie lashes, and then remain in Goal untill he give such security for l good behaviour as the Court shall approve of.

Maiden discharged giveing security. Whereas an Order past Yestern for the whipping of one Fergus Maiden for Petty Larceny as also tl he should remain in Prison without bail or mainprise untill the ne Court, and then to be whipt again, and after that to remain in Goal untill he should give security for his good behaviour, but the Cou upon mature deliberation had, are of opinion that he has been sufficiently punished for the Crime aforesaid, It is therefore ordered that upon the said Fergus Maidens giveing security according to tl aforesaid order, the Sherrif release him out of Custody. COMPILER'S NOTE: So 7th great grandma Margaret Thatcher Cammack ated a store and sold Mr Uriell the "Hatt" which motheaten under the brim and had a notch cutt i brim. Mr Uriell wasn't hanging his hat in her but he sure as heck was storing it there.

Fergus Maiden was apparently an indentured serv. Poor fellow did win one round in court.

Camlet--a kind of rich cloth of Oriental origin supposed to have been made formerly of camel's and silk or other combinations.

He appears prominently on the Rappahannock County court records. By purchase and patent he acquired considerable land in the area which became Richmond County in 1692. It appears from the records he died circa 1685 as at this date Mrs. Margaret Cammack began appearing on the records in a manner she would not if she had been feme covert. The name has been rendered Cammack - Comack - Cammock - Comock &c.

: She was the widow of \*Sylvester Thatcher (16??-1667) by whom she had four children three of whom left issue. In 1709, when she wrote her will, she described herself as "very ancient;" this document makes it certain she had two daughters named Mary - one by each spouse. Naming all her living children, she bequeathed her estate to her three daughters by Warwick Cammack. (See Thatcher genealogical chart, p.268.)

In 1688 the court issued him a birth certificate, certifying he was the lawful son of Warwick and Margaret Cammack; d.s.p.

\*Mary Cammack (16??-1743)  
m(1) \*Francis Sterne (c.1638-1713) by whom she had two sons; m(2) \*Isaac Truck (Trocq) (16??-1739) by whom she had no issue; they moved to Caroline County, with her three sons, where both died testate. Mary's eldest son was a bastard; he lived to be very old predeceasing several children who married into genteel family. (q.v.), P.195

\*Susanna Cammack (168?-1747)  
m(1) +John Foster (16??-1711) of Essex County and had an only child; m(2) \*Gilbert Metcalfe (168?-1737) by whom she had no issue, (q.v.), p.131. There is considerable record of Susanna (Cammack) Foster Metcalfe and her spouses in Essex and Richmond counties. The only child of John and Susanna (Cammack) Foster was, viz:

\*Margaret Cammack (167?-1740) m. \*Dr. Paul Micou (1658-1736) of Essex Co. where they both died testate leaving a large family of children concerning whom considerable has been published. Perhaps their child concerning whom less had been written is their daughter, Mary Micou, next below.

- (1) \*William Cammack (c.1697-1783) of Caroline and Spotsylvania counties; he married and left a numerous progeny.  
(2) \*Francis Sterne (c.1700-1755) of Carline County; he married and left progeny in Caroline and Stafford counties.  
(3) David Sterne (170?-c.1748), m. by 1733 \*Ann (Anderson) Evins(Evans) (17??-1775), widow of John Evins and daughter of Paulin Anderson; she moved to Amelia County where her will remains of record (WB#2, p.157).

- (1) Ann Foster  
m(1) 1727 \*Samuel Barber who died testate in 1736 leaving two sons; m(2) William Jordan, Gentleman; (q.v.), p.9.

- (1) \*Mary Micou (17??-1771) m(1) \*Leonard Hill, Gent. (17??-1734 of Hill Park, Essex County; m(2) 1736, \*Col. Joshua Fry (17??-1754). The wills of Col. and Mrs. Fry are record in Albemarle County; she left issue by each spouse.
