- 5-William E. (?), (1742-1820), of Halifax Co., Va.; Am. Rev.; m Elizabeth Jearnigan, of Va.;
- 4-Jesse J. (1776-1838), of Va.; removed to Henderson Co., Tenn., 1830, to Red River Co., Tex., 1833; killed by Indians while serving the Republic; personal friend of Sam Houston; m 1809, Mary White McCorkle (kinswoman of Gen. James White, the founder of Knoxville, Tenn.);
- 3-John Marr (1814-76), of Nacogdoches, Tex.; m 1842, Malvina Kemp Noble (1823-63; Levi's, m Jane Stean, of Miss.; the town of Kemp, Tex., is named for her;

- 8-Duncan **Campbell**, from the west coast of Scotland thru Ireland to Pa., 1742; Lancaster Co., S.C., 1756; m Mary McCoy;

Gordon Lang); II-Malvina Kemp; III-John Bennett (m Lutie McKee); IV-Archibald Flint (m Grace Chapin); V-Pauline (1 above); VI-Noble (1893-1905); VII-Mary Kate (m Harrison McGill); VIII-Olive; IX-Texas (d childhood); X-Jessie (d childhood).
