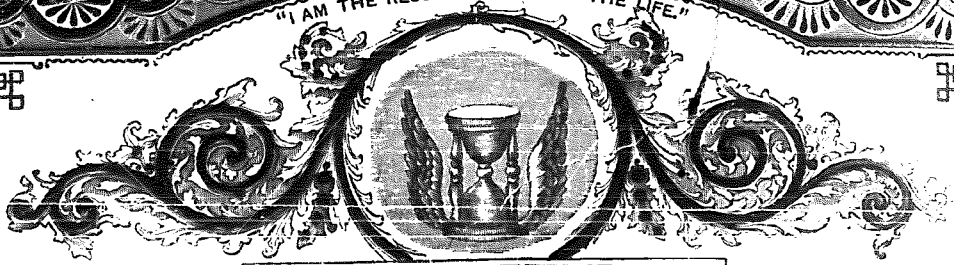

My father was the only son. I never knew any of my aunts. They have long since died and I do not know who they were. My mother's people were Garlies, Coates, Bruces. Her only brother, Dr. R. C. Bruce, practiced medicine very successfully in Greenville, S. C. and died about 10 years ago. She also cousins - Bruces - who were prominent merchants in Greenville. Another cousin was a school teacher and still another superintendent of education at one time. I know nothing of my father's people except the little information above. I do know that my father's father was post master at Kershaw during the civil war and for that reason stayed at home. My mother's father was too old to join. This is meager knowledge about one's forebears. I have wished many times that I had been interested in my family tree earlier in life, before the death of my parents and my old aunt, my mother's sister. I would so love to see your dear baby. I know what joy she does bring to you and your husband.
