The Passing Of Miss Sallie Stanley

The death of Miss Sallie Stanley near midnight on April 17th brought sadness to many in our community and especially to the older citizens to whom she had been known since her childhood. She and her brother, Mr. T. P. Stanley, were the only children of that patriot, scholar and gentleman, Major Marcellus Stanley and his lovely wife who had been Miss Julia Pope, sister of Col. Frank Pope, of Oglethorpe county. In the early years of their married life Major and Mrs. Stanley lived in the house which later became the home of Mrs. Ann Henderson and stood where the Athens postoffice building now stands. Later, Major Stanley bought the beautiful place on Dearing street where his family lived for so many happy years and which now belongs to Mr. Lamar Rucker. On her mother's side, through her great-grandmother Strong, Miss Stanley was related to the Gordines, Newtons and Moses of this community and the Strong of Mississippi.

Miss Stanley was closely identified with the Athens people all her life; was educated here, with a year of musical training in the Boston conservatory; was a devoted member of the Methodist church; for several years its organist, and up to the time of her death an officer in the Woman's Missionary Society and teacher in the Sunday School. Her religious convictions were clearly defined and they guided her decisions and purposes. If her manner was at times abrupt, her motives were always right, and she was loyal to duty and faithful

in friendship. She inherited her mother's sense of humor and like her was a skilled administrator in household affairs and an agreeable hostess when it fell to her lot to fill this position.

How well some of us remember her as a young lady—her bright eyes, her lustrous, carefully arranged hair, her beautiful clothes, her quick repartees, her pleasant satisfaction with this pleasant world. The years brought inevitable changes, and she herself could not easily change; but worthy ideals and inherited abilities carried her through and her life was of definite value to many individuals and to the community. Perhaps her most fruitful years were those spent in the household of Mr. Charles H. Newton, directing the domestic affairs and guiding the children in their satisfactory and beautiful development. In the midst of the definite responsibilities that fell to her, her musical talents and training were a source of refreshment to herself and of pleasure to others. She was a good pianist. Her cultivated voice was naturally sweet and she sang with taste and feeling. Particularly did she excel in the negro "spirituals" with their mournful minors, which she had taken down in notation from the old family servants living in Oglethorpe county. One wishes that she had compiled them in a collection which certainly would have been a treasure to lovers of these plaintive and appealing melodies.

Miss Stanley's last illness was of brief duration, and her end was peaceful. Her lot had not been one of unusual or extreme experience. Her characteristics fell within the range of the majority of those in her rank. She experienced both joy and sorrow and bore the burdens and was sustained by the hopes that come near approach to trust you'd share along life's beaten highway. But always she was the child of her good parents, always of the fellowship of the honorable and the merciful; true daughter of the church and a humble, trustful follower of Jesus Christ.
