

The first Marshall to come to America was Thomas Marshall, a descendant of the Earl of Pembroke, from Lincolnshire, England, arriving in the New England Colony in 1633, settling in Boston. He was a ferrykeeper in 1635, Deacon of the First Church, a select man in 1648, and served in the Court for a number of years. Accompanying him to America were two sons by his first wife, Thomas and Samuel, and two daughters, Sarah and Frances. A son by his second wife, Eliekim, was killed by Indians during King Philip's War.

Samuel Marshall moved to Windsor, Conn. ca 1636, serving as Magistrate, fought in King Philip's War, attaining rank of Capt. at Battle of Fort Narragansett where he died with his men in 1675. He left nine children.

One was Daniel Marshall, his ninth child, born 1706, farmer, m. 1st Hannah Drake 11/11/1742 who died following the birth of a son, Daniel, m. 2d Martha Stearns, 6/23/1747. By his second wife he had ten children: Abraham, John, Joseph, Eunice, Mary, Moses, Levi, Solomon, Zaccheus, and Benjamin who died in Revolutionary War. Daniel was converted to the Baptist Faith by Rev. George Whitefield in 1745, and left Windsor to work as a Missionary among the Indians about 1752. He removed from Conn. to Va., thence to Guilford Co., N. C. in 1755, in S. C. 1760, and to Ga. in 1770. He founded the first Baptist Church in Georgia, on Kiokee Creek, in 1772. At one time he was arrested for preaching contrary to the rites of the Anglican Church. Three of the Marshalls were preachers at the Kiokee Baptist Church, founded by Daniel. Daniel Marshall served as Chaplain during the Rev. War. His LWT dtd 11/28/1783, pvd 11/23/1784, Columbia Co., Ga. is headed up "I, Daniel Marshall, a Minister of the Gospel," and a Columbia Co. deed dtd 8/14/1795, Daniel Marshall, Minister of the Gospel, left 50 acres on Augusta Road and Kiokee Creek, heirs signing release to Abraham, Daniel, John, Levi, Solomon, Joseph, Moses and Zachariah Marshall, and Elias Welbourne.

Issue of Daniel Marshall of Columbia Co., Ga., who d. 1784, follows:

I. Eunice Marshall m. John Pittman, had two sons.

II. Mary Marshall m. Elias Welbourne, had nine children. His LWT names issue: James, Marshall, Lucy, Ruby Davis, Mary Fleming, Nancy Bailey, Martha Briscoe and Selina Hill.

III. Daniel Marshall, his LWT dtd 6/30/1859, pvd 8/1/1859 Columbia Co., Ga., naming issue: John G. Marshall; William Mercer Marshall; Eugenia Catherine Marshall m. Benson Coke Bailey 3/27/1852 Columbia Co., Ga.; Mary Ann Augusta; Daniel M. Marshall; Emily A. Reid; Martha Reid; and Mary Harris.

IV. Abraham Marshall, Rev. War Soldier, b. 1748 Winsor, Conn, d. 8/15/1819 m. 1792 Ann Waller, Pastor of Kiokee Creek Baptist Church after the death of his father, for fifty years. His LWT dtd 7/19/1819, pvd 1/9/1820 Columbia Co., Ga. Issue follows:

1. Jabez Marshall.
2. Pleiades Marshall m. Martha Flournoy.
3. Jubian Orron Marshall, died age 5 months.
4. Abraham Marshall, died childhood.
5. Hubian Orion Marshall, a second one, removed to Alabama.

V. John Marshall, his LWT pvd 4/5/1809 Columbia Co., Ga., naming issue: Mariam, wife of G. Morris; Sarah, wife of Thomas Jones; Elizabeth, and Eunice.

VI. Zaccheus Marshall, preacher, d. 1821. Issue: Samuel, Daniel, Elbert.

VII. Levi Marshall m. Sarah Wynne, his LWT dtd 8/11/1807, pvd 9/8/1807 Columbia Co., Ga. Issue: Elisha; Emily who m. John Pullen; Sally; Polly who m. Nathan Crawford; Levi, d. young; Joseph Jr., his LWT dtd 8/21/1817 pvd 11/17/1817 Columbia Co., Ga., naming wife, Sarah and Dr. Nathan Crawford and children, Sarah Frances, Peter, Levi, Eliza who m. Thomas Bayless; and John who d. in infancy.

VIII. Moses Marshall. Columbia Co. Ga. deed 9/9/1794, Moses Marshall and his wife, Mary, et al deed to William Beckham, 160 acres on Greenbriar Creek.

IX. Solomon Marshall m. Sarah Crawford, Deputy Sheriff in Columbia Co.

X. Joseph Marshall, b. 1765, Rev. War Soldier, m. 1st Elizabeth Waller, b. 1787, 2d Elizabeth Edding, 3rd, Nancy McNeal. By his first wife he had Joseph, Daniel, Mary and Martha. By wife, Nancy, he had, Joseph, Huldah, Selina and Daniel. His LWT dtd 9/16/1817, pvd 4/24/1819 Columbia Co., Ga, names wife Ann and children: Mary, Hulda, Salina, Joseph, Daniel, Pleiades (son).

XI. Sarah Marshall, died young.

XII. Benjamin Marshall, killed during Revolutionary War.
