

## MILLEDGE

Thomas Milledge, b. 1690 England, carpenter, d. 7/29/1733, came to Savannah, Georgia with General Oglethorpe in the good ship "Anne", landing Feb. 1st, 1733. His wife, Elizabeth, b. 1692 England, d. 6/2/1734. They brought five small children with them, two of whom died shortly after arrival. Issue follows:

I. Frank Milledge, d. age 5, Savannah, Ga.

II. James Milledge, d. 11/4/1734, aged 2 years, Savannah, Ga.

III. John Milledge, b. 1720 England, was Commander in a Troop of Rangers in 1742 under General Oglethorpe against the Spanish invasion of Ga. An early deed, Colonial DB C1, deed of gift, "I, John Milledge, for love and affection I do bear for Richard Milledge, my loving brother, carpenter, a town lot in Savannah, No. 6." Another, Colonial DB J, P. 20, 8/28/1749, Griffith Williams to John Milledge, Quartermaster, at the bottom of which deed contains: "Received the contents for my brother, John Milledge," signed, Mary Bell, wife of Mathew Bell, Cooper and Elizabeth Milledge, his agent. Issue follows:

1. John Milledge, b. 1757 Savannah, Ga., d. 2/9/1818 Augusta, Ga., bur. Summerville cemetery, near Augusta, tombstone reading: "Benefactor of the University of Georgia." He was Attorney General of Ga., elected to Continental Congress, Governor of Ga. 1803-1806. He studied law under Chief Justice Anthony Stokes, was a Rev. War Soldier, fought in Wilkes Co., Ga., at siege of Augusta, and at Savannah. He m. 1st Martha Galphin, making their home near Augusta in 1790. He m. 2d Ann Lamar of Edgefield Co., S. C. and by her had three children. From Christian Index dated 5/9/1860: "Died, Ann Milledge, 75 years old, wife of the late Governor, died 2/23/1860 at Sand Hills, near Augusta." Issue follows:

c. John Milledge, Colonel, b. 1/8/1814 Richmond Co., Ga., m. Catharine, b. 1820 S. C. Issue: Richard, b. 1843 Richmond Co.; John, b. 1837, Capt., C. S. A., 1st Ga. Regt., m. Fanny C. Robinson from Va.; Catharine, b. 1839 Richmond Co.; and Gaynia S., son, b. 1849 Richmond Co., Ga.

IV. Richard Milledge, b. 1714 England, his LWT dtd 11/15/1768, pvd 1/5/1769, Savannah, Ga., bequeaths his lands at Tuckasee Kings to be sold and divided between wife, Mary and four sons. Exrs, John Milledge and Philip Box.

V. Sarah Milledge, b. 1715 England m. Nicholas Rigbye 1/4/1742, Savannah, Ga. and had issue: Elizabeth Rigbye, b. 9/9/1743 and Sarah, b. 1/25/1744, Savannah, Ga. Colonial DB J, P. 298-299, the Deposition of Henry Chiffelle dtd 6/6/1758, swears on 1/4/1742 that he joined in marriage, old style, Nicholas Rigbye and Sarah Milledge, Spinster, both of Savannah. Birthdates of their children are inscribed at foot of this document.

VI. Mary Milledge m. Mathew Bell, Copper.
