PREFATORY.

HE MACON CITY DIRECTORY FOR 1890-91, is herewith presented, with the assurance that, in completeness and accuracy, it is the equal of any Directory ever issued for this or any other city. The canvass for information was arranged to follow immediately after the census enumerators, and the Directory reporters were specially instructed to make close inquiry as to the completeness of the enumerators work. The enumerators were notified that this would be done, and that they would be called upon to correct all errors or omissions discovered, and the result of this plan was an almost absolutely complete census, and the most thorough Directory canvass which, in an experience of twenty years, the manager of this work has ever seen.

The City of Macon has entered upon an era of wonderful advancement and growth, and there are doubtless many people here to-day, whose names will not be found herein, but if the name of a white citizen fails to appear, it may be safely asserted that he had no recognized business or residence location in Macon in June, 1890, and this statement may very nearly be made with regard to the colored citizens as well.

The canvass for the present work embraces, not only the city proper, but also the suburbs of Vineville, East Macon, South Macon, Huguenin Heights, etc., or in other words, the Directory represents the entire population within a distance of two miles from the City Hall in every direction.

The former volume for 1889-89 contained 9423 names—5932 white and 3491 colored. The present volume gives 12,424 names—7,999 white and 4,425 colored; a gain of 2,067 white and of 934 colored, total 3,001.

As illustrating the changes which are now so rapidly taking place in Macon, 3,082 names which were in the former volume have been omitted from these pages, and 6,083 new names, or very nearly one half of the entire number, have been added.

A careful count of the census taken in connection with the canvass, exhibits a population within the corporate limits of 22,600; 11,543 white and 11,057 colored, and the suburbs embraced in the canvass have a population of 8,786 white, and 4,309 colored; total 13,095. or a total population within the radius mentioned of 35,695.

The support extended to this work has been very gratifying, exhibit ing, as it does, a largely increased recognition of the importance of a GOOD DIRECTORY for the city, and in conclusion, thanks are extended to the friends and patrons of the work and the hope expressed that this volume will be found to merit fully and completely the above title.

GUIDE TO STREETS AND AVENUES IN MACON.

In consulting the Guide, it should be borne in mind that while the streets of Macon are in most instances laid out diagonally to the points of the compass, yet for convenience this fact is not recognized, and streets running parallel with the river are described as running from east to west, and those running from the river as running from north to south, so, in consulting the General Directory, the north side of a street is the side nearest the river, the east and west sides are the left and right sides respectively as one goes from the river. The large number of unnumbered streets in the suburbs, where the only method of locating a house is by giving the side of the street it is on, and the number of doors from a cross street, renders this explanation necessary. It should be further mentioned here that several of the streets mentioned here, some within the corporate limits, have been arbitrarily named, in order to definitely locate the parties residing upon them.
