

In the application, Mr. Pentecost stated that he was a meber of Company F, 38th Tennessee Regiment, in which he was enlisted September, 1861. The command surrendered at Murphy, N. C., but he was on his way home at the time, having been discharged a day or two before the surrender.

Mr. Pentecost was a pensioner of Barrow County.

I suggest that Mrs. Pentecost make application for pension, if she was married prior to the year 1920, and that she attach this letter to the application, so that she may have the benefit of the proof referred to.
