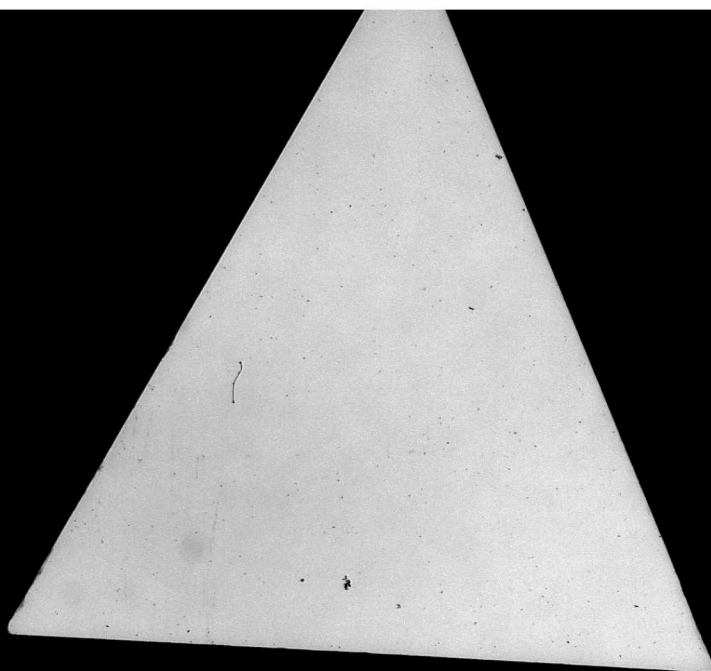

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawyer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish full and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applicant resides, they must go before the Ordinary and testify. The attestation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not answer.

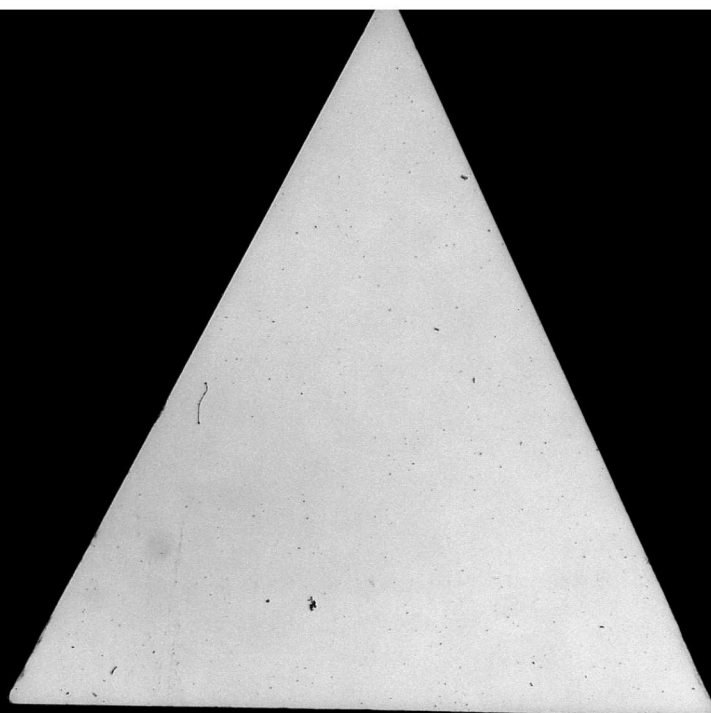

In order to deal unreservedly, directly, and to enable all parties interested to understand the laws governing allowances to disabled soldiers, as well as the rules adopted by the Government clothing the personnel, the following suggestions are submitted:

1. If a soldier is disabled by an injury or disease, the wound should be carefully and fully examined by the physician, and followed by a complete physical and mental examination, both by applicant and physician, and followed by a complete medical and surgical history of the disease should be given, treating the disability by positive proofs to the surgeon.
2. If the applicant claims disability from disease contracted in the service, a full and carefully stated history of the disease should be given, stating the nature of the disease has been rendered *undoubtedly and essentially* useless, in such a way that an arm or leg, unless the arm or leg has been rendered *undoubtedly and essentially* useless, no longer has any use.
3. It will not be allowed to say that an arm is "substantially useless for ordinary purposes of life," etc. There is no substitution to the clause of the Act in reference to the arm or leg, but the limb must for all purposes be "substantially and essentially useless."
4. It would seem to be a fair reconstruction of the Act, and the words above quoted, to say that limbs that are "substantially and essentially useless," etc.
5. If papers are returned for correction, and amendments are asked by the applicant, that the leg or arm is "substantially and essentially useless," etc., to require the examinee to use words such as "the leg must be made *undoubtedly and essentially* useless."
6. Every applicant must be certified by the Ordinary of the county of the residence of the applicant. The certificate of any other will not be received in any case.
7. The Ordinaries of the several counties are specially requested to call the attention of the physicians and applicants to these points.

2. The law makes no allowance for an arm or leg, unless the arm or leg has been rendered substantially and essentially useless.
3. It will not answer to say that an arm is "substantially useless for ordinary pursuits of life, etc." There is no qualification to the clause of the Act in reference to the arm or leg, but the limb must for all purposes be "substantially and essentially useless."
4. If the application is for a wounded leg, it would seem to be a fair construction of the Act, and the words above quoted, to say that unless the injury is such as to require the constant use of crutch or stick, that the leg is not "substantially and essentially useless."
5. If papers are returned for correction, and amendments are added to any of the affidavits, the amendments must be made under oath before an officer, and the proofs must show that the amendments have been duly sworn to.
6. Every application must be certified by the Ordinary of the county of the residence of the applicant. The certificate of any other will not be received in any case.
