We never saw him die but we are informed by persons who saw him die and were at the burial, that he died of Chronic Diarrhoea at home in furlough, near Pine Log, Barton County Ga. on the 18th day of April 1862. We live in the same vicinity and have lived there ever since the war. We know that C. W. Caldwell has never been heard from since the war ended. Chisley Bostic, A. L. White and D. P. Randolph being sworn say, that C. W. Caldwell died as above set forth and was buried; that they were at his burial; that he was at home in furlough sick of Chronic Diarrhoea at the time of his death; and that the disease was contracted in the service and of which he died.


