As originally stated he had measles in the war, and relapsed, settling on his lungs, from the effects of which he never recovered but died in August 1871. Applicant is his lawful widow, without means of support, and unable by reason of infirmity to support herself by labor of any

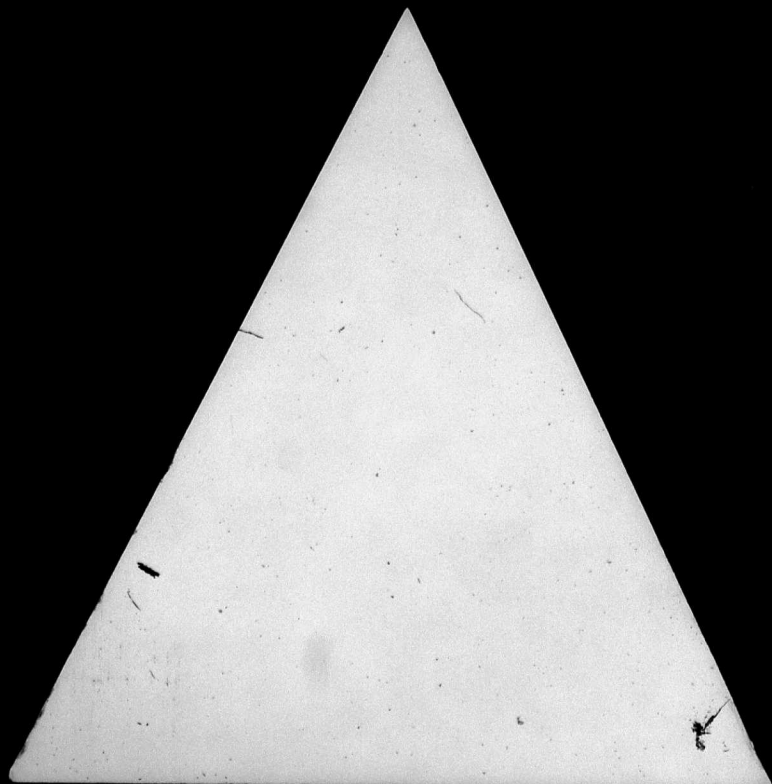

The Dr. called it hemorrhage of the lungs when the said Patrick went to the army he was healthy and stout. He had had health and a bad cough when he came home after the war. He had measles in the army which settled on his lungs and in a short time after he had the measles he was taken prisoner and carried north by the Federals and when he got home his health was ruined and he gradually grew worse and lingered along till in August 1871 when he died of Consumption or Hemorrhage of the lungs about eight miles from Jasper Dickens County, Georgia.
