

Those whose husbands died in the army of wounds or disease contracted in the service,

Those whose husbands went to the army and have never been heard from since the war,

Those whose husbands were wounded in the army and have since died from the direct effects of the wounds.

Those whose husbands contracted disease in the service, and who after the war, died of the disease caused by the service. The disease directly causing the death.

No widow is entitled unless she was the wife of the soldier during the war, and has never

The law does not provide for any one living out of the State of Georgia, or who did not live in the State at the date of the Act.

The facts to establish a claim must be substantiated by the testimony of three witnesses who personally know of the enlistment of the husband and his death and the immediate cause

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawyer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish /nll and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applicant resides, they must go before the Ordinary and testify. The attestation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not answer.





I have your letter of May 27, 1932, in which you request to be furnished with the military record of C. T. Debbs, who it is stated served as a private, sergeant and 2d lieutenant in Company D, let Regiment Georgia Cavalry, Confederate States irmy.

The records show that C. T. Dabbs, private, Company D, 1st Regiment Georgia Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted March 8, 1862, at Dallas, Paulding County, Georgia, and was elected 4th segment, August 1, 1862, He was promoted to 2d lieutenant in October, 1863, exact date not shown, and was wounded at Russelville, Tennessee, December 10, 1863. The company muster roll for November and December, 1864, last on file, shows him absent, "Wounded at Russelville, Tennessee." No later record of him has been found.

It is proper to add, however, that the collection of Confederate records on file in my office is far from complete and failure to find the complete means conclusive proof that such person did not serve during some period not covered by the records.

1. The first marriage is proven to have taken place prior to the year 1881, and the death of Mr. C. T. Dabbs is proven to have occurred about the year 1890.

2. The second marriage is proven to have taken place by the affidavit proving the death of Mr. T. M. Graves, he being mentioned therein as "Mrs. J. H. Leake's second husband."

3. The death of Mr. J. H. Leake is proven to have pocurred in the year 1917.

4. The letter from The Adjutant-General of the United States proves the military service of Mr. C. T. Dabbs, from March 8, 1862 to November-December, 1864, when he was reported, on the muster rolls as being absent, "Wounded at Russellville, Tennessee."

5.It is proven, by the affidavit of Mrs. J. H. Ragsdale, that Mr. C. T. Dabbs was unable to return to his command from the time he came homefrom his command, in the year 1865, on account of a wound he had received, in the limit which rendered him a cripple until his death. This proof completes the official record.
