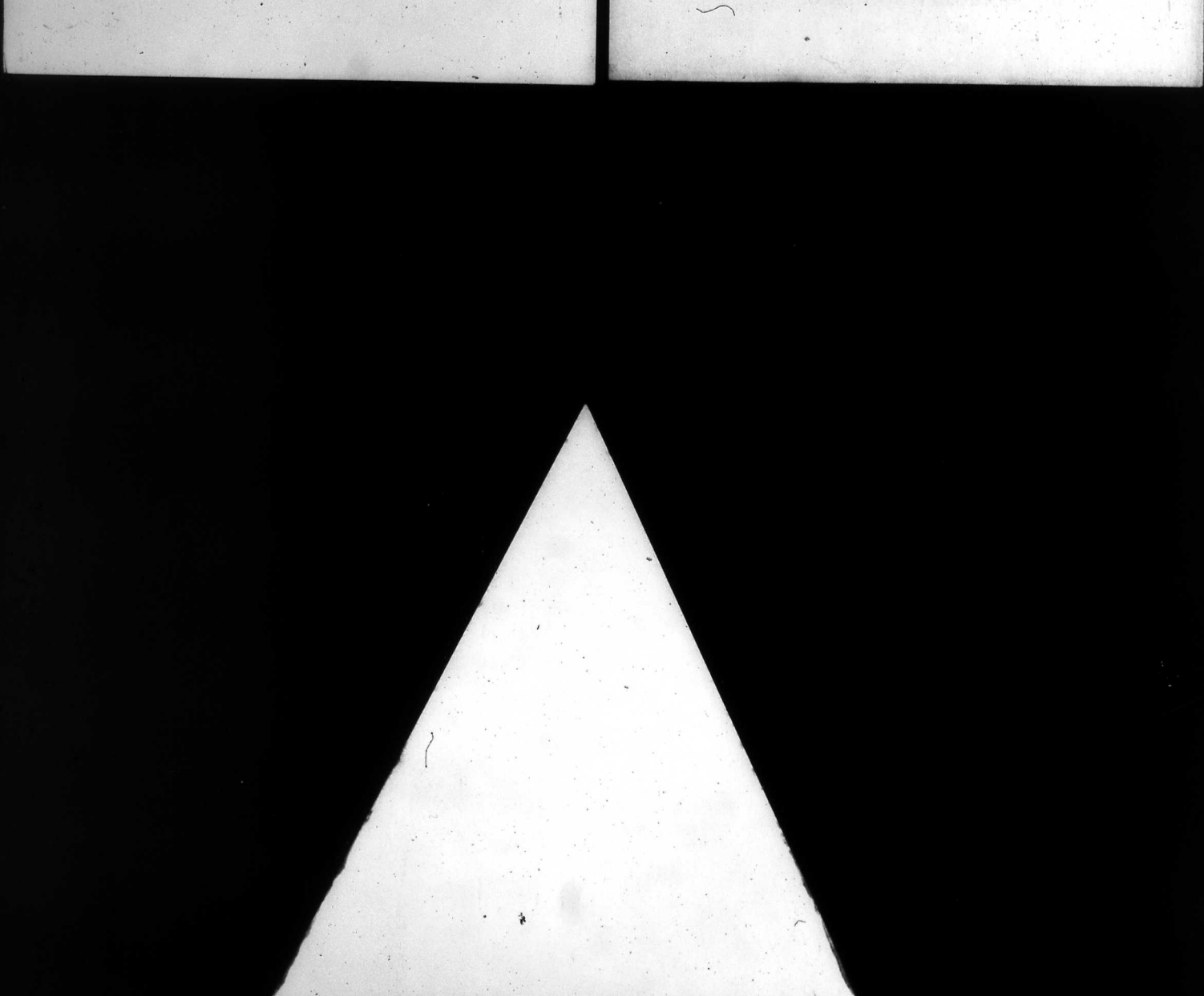

The law does not provide for any one living out of the State of Georgia, or who did not live in the State at the date of the Act.

The facts to establish a claim must be substantiated by the testimony of three witnesses who personally know of the enlistment of the husband and his death and the immediate cause of the death.

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawyer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish full and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applicant resides, they must go before the Ordinary and testify. The attestation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not answer.

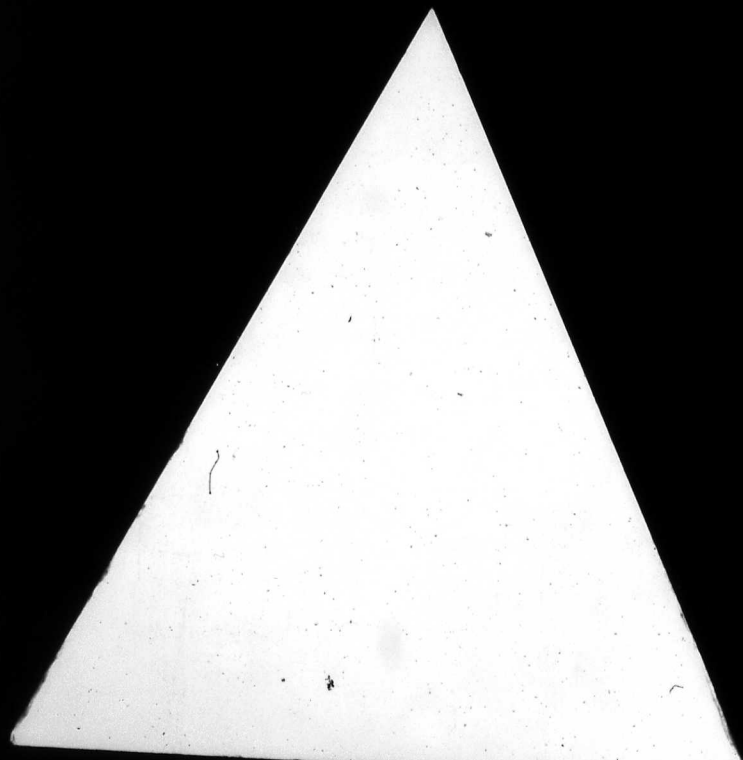

My dear Mr. Tarver:

I have your letter of May 27, 1932, in which you request to be furnished with the military record of C. T. Dabbs, who it is stated served as a private, sergeant and 2d lieutenant in Company D, 1st Regiment Georgia Cavalry, Confederate States Army.

The records show that C. T. Dabbs, private, Company D, 1st Regiment Georgia Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted March 8, 1862, at Dallas, Paulding County, Georgia, and was elected 4th sergeant, August 1, 1862. He was promoted to 2d lieutenant in October, 1863, exact date not shown, and was wounded at Russellville, Tennessee, December 10, 1863. The company muster roll for November and December, 1864, last on file, shows him absent, "wounded at Russellville, Tennessee." No later record of him has been found.

It is proper to add, however, that the collection of Confederate records on file in my office is far from complete and failure to find the complete record of any person thereon is by no means conclusive proof that such person did not serve during some period not covered by the records.

1. The first marriage is proven to have taken place
prior to the year 1881, and the death of Mr. C. T. Dabbs is proven
to have occurred about the year 1890.

2. The second marriage is proven to have taken place
by the affidavit proving the death of Mr. T. M. Graves, he being
mentioned therein as "Mrs. J. H. Leake's second husband."

3. The death of Mr. J. H. Leake is proven to have
occurred in the year 1917.

4. The letter from The Adjutant-General of the United
States proves the military service of Mr. C. T. Dabbs, from March 8,
1862 to November-December, 1864, when he was reported, on the
muster rolls as being absent, "Wounded at Russellville, Tennessee."

5. It is proven, by the affidavit of Mrs. J. H. Ragsdale,
that Mr. C. T. Dabbs was unable to return to his command from the
time he came home from his command, in the year 1865, on account of
a wound he had received, ~~in the leg~~, and which rendered him a
cripple until his death. This proof completes the official
record.

He further states, that the reason he never made an application sooner, was because of the fact that the State of Georgia did not include State troops until recently; that just in the last year or so, State troops of other States, were not included in the pension acts of the legislature. So far as his service in the army is concerned, he re-affirms that he did perform the service as indicated in his application, and respectfully requests a consideration of the same.
