





I have not been able to approve the application of Mrs. Marthn Jans Bailey for a pension as the widow of James Wimberly Bailey afor the reason that she was married to her soldier husband in 1882.

An impression seems to be throughout the State that the marriage date of widows has been advanced, but though a bill was introduced in the Senate and papered that body advancing the marriage date of widows, this bill did not pass the House and did not be come a law. There has been no change in the law regarding the eligibility of widows.
