The Attorney General of Georgia has ruled that widows of Confederate soldiers are eligible for a pension upon the death of their second hus-bands if they are still unmarried and if other requirements are met.

Your application for a pension was disapproved in 1940 because at that time the Legal Depart-ment of Georgia had ruled that vidows who re-married were imeligible for a Confederate pen-

It will be necessary for you to furnish proof of the service during the War Between the States of your soldier husband, Charles A. Kirke. You might obtain this information from the State Capitol, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, or through your Senator or Congressman in Washington, D. C.

If you write to Washington, D.C., inform your Senator or Representative that it is necessary for you to have this information to complete your application for a Confederate pension.

You will have to furnish this office with a certified copy of your marriage to your soldier husband, Charles A. Kirke, proof of the death of your second husband, Mr. Hester and give us his full name. You should also state that you are now a name. widow.
