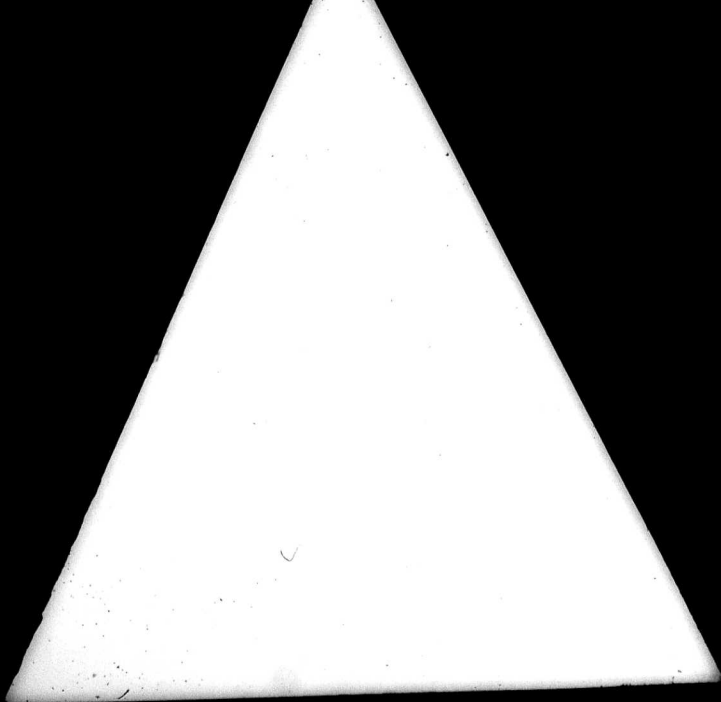

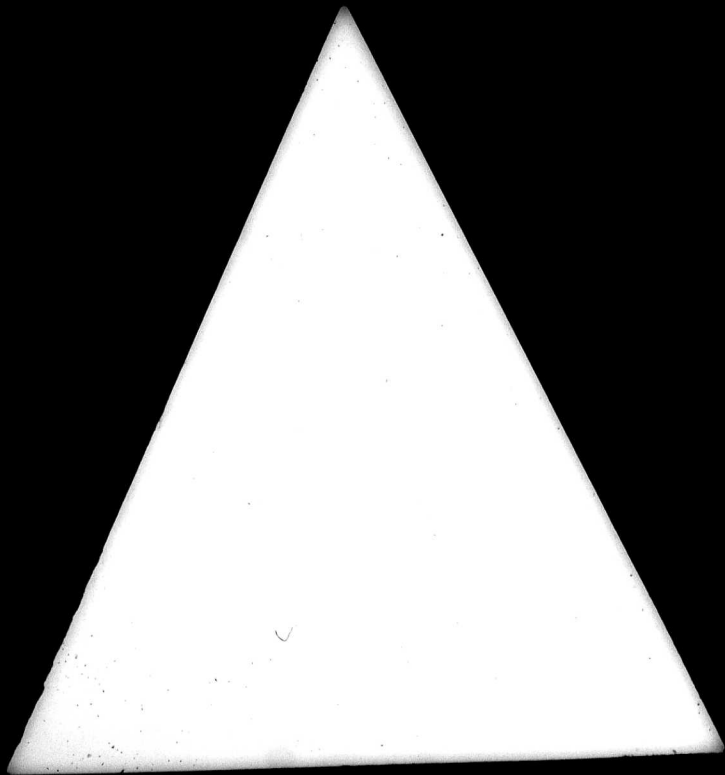
Dear Judge Monroe:
