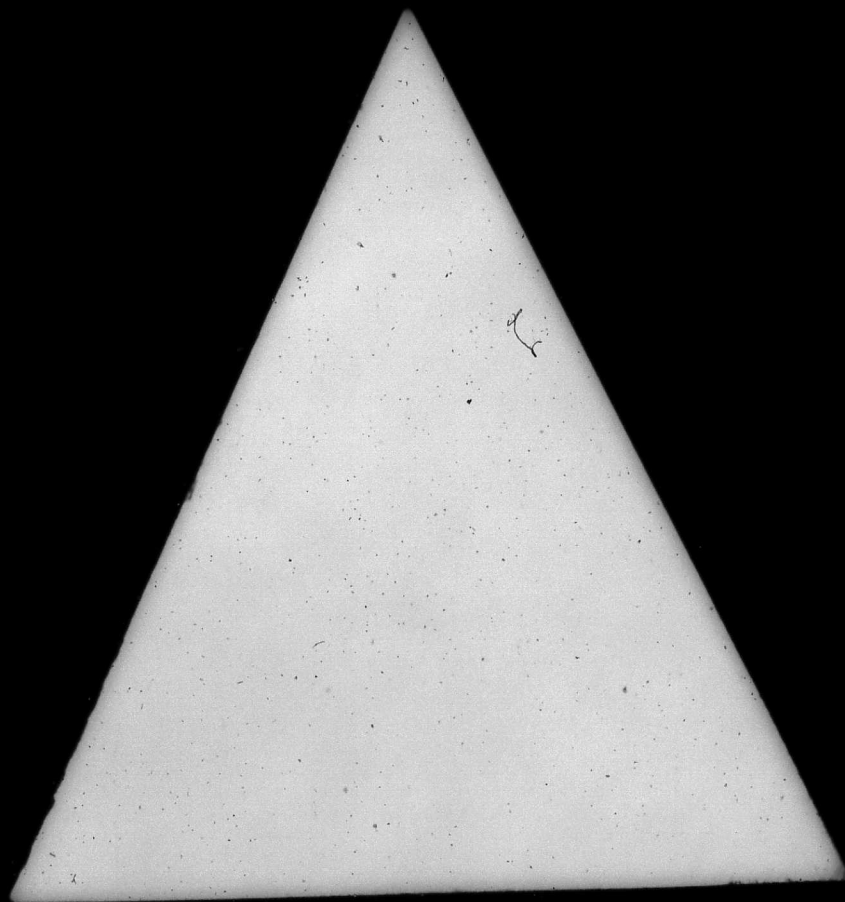

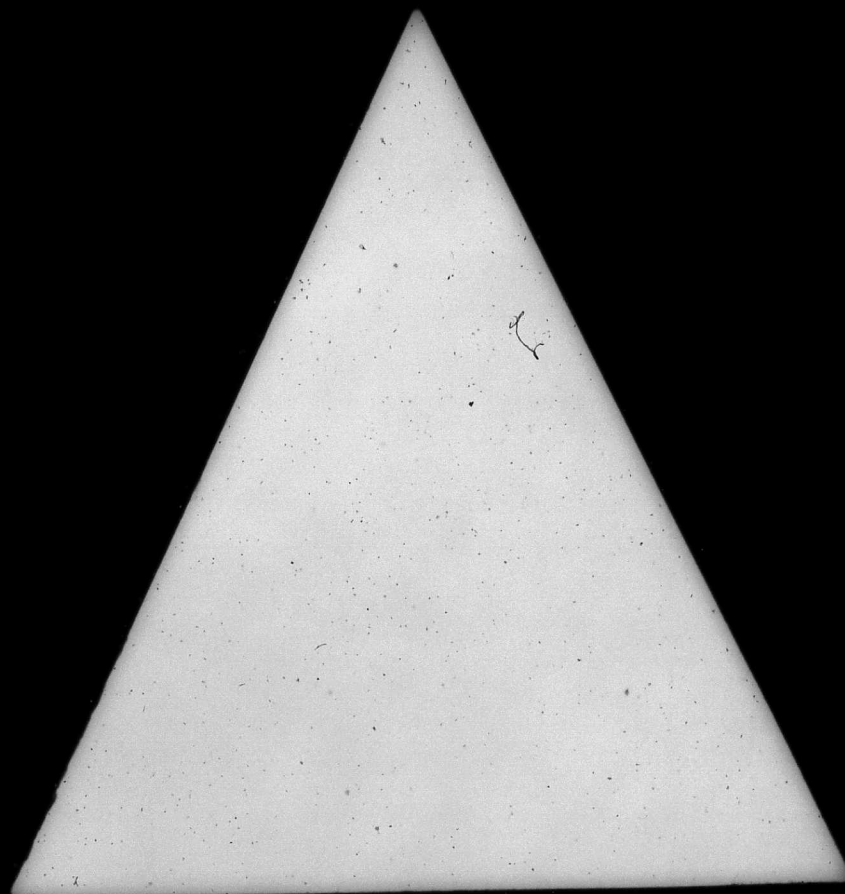

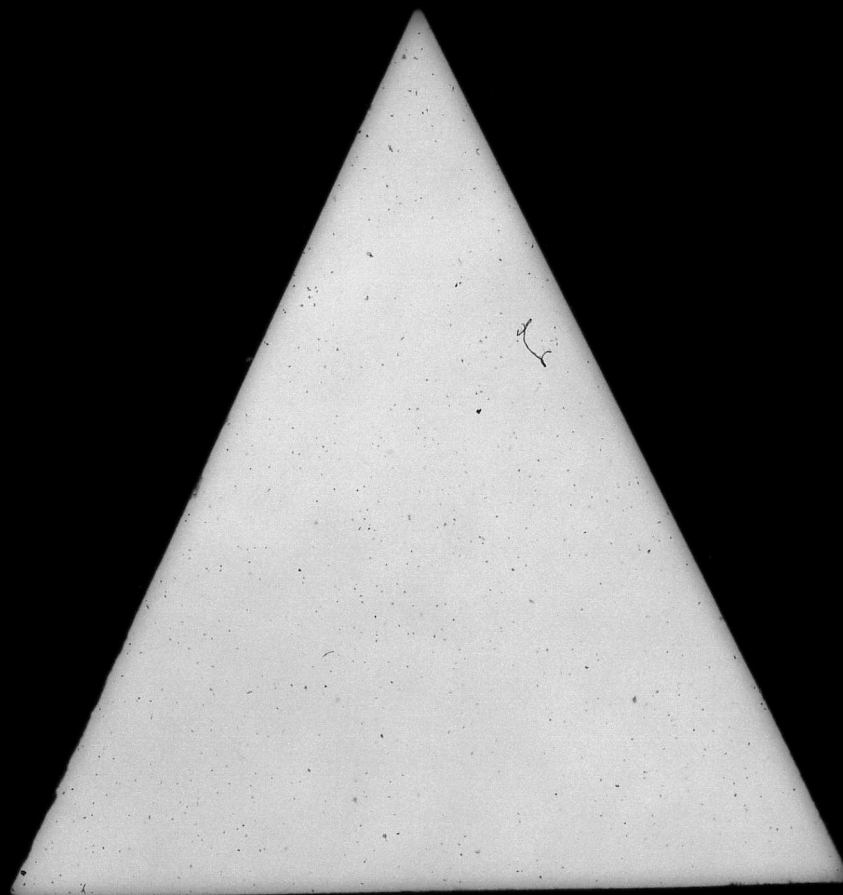

4. If the application is for a wounded leg, it would seem to be a fair construction of the Act, and the words above quoted, to say that unless the injury is such as to require the constant use of crutch or stick, that the leg is not "substantially and essentially useless."

5. If papers are returned for correction, and amendments are added to any of the affidavits, the amendments must be made under oath before an officer, and the proofs must show that the amendments have been duly sworn to.

6. Every application must be certified by the Ordinary of the county of the residence of the applicant. The certificate of any other will not be received in any case.

The Ordinaries of the several counties are specially requested to call the attention of the physicians and applicants to these points.

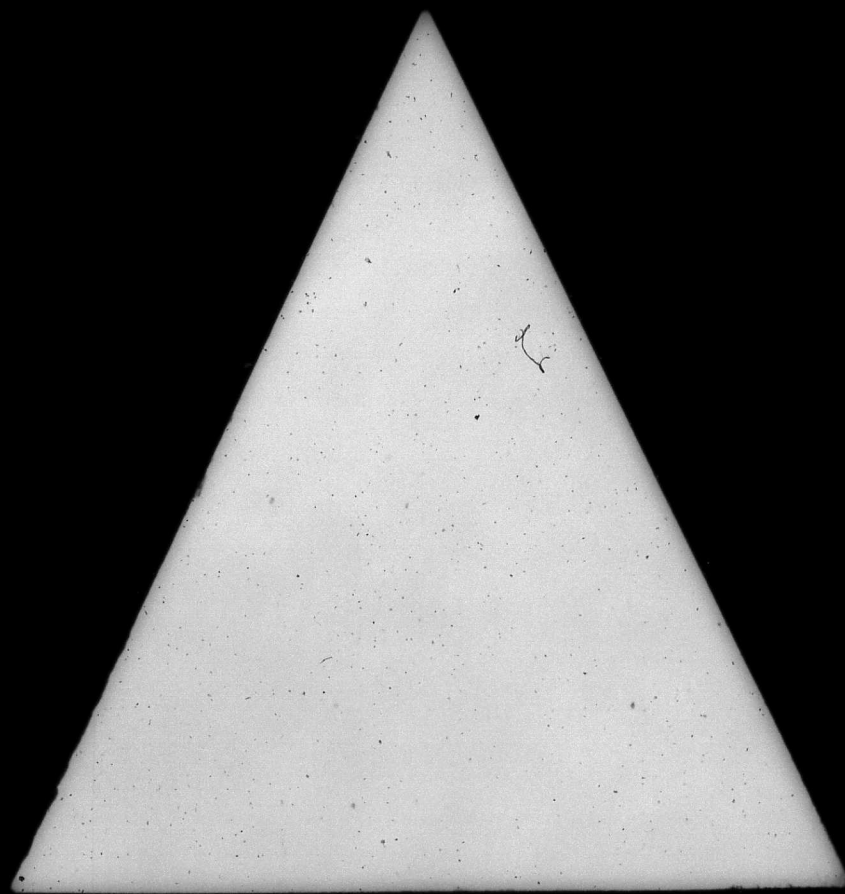

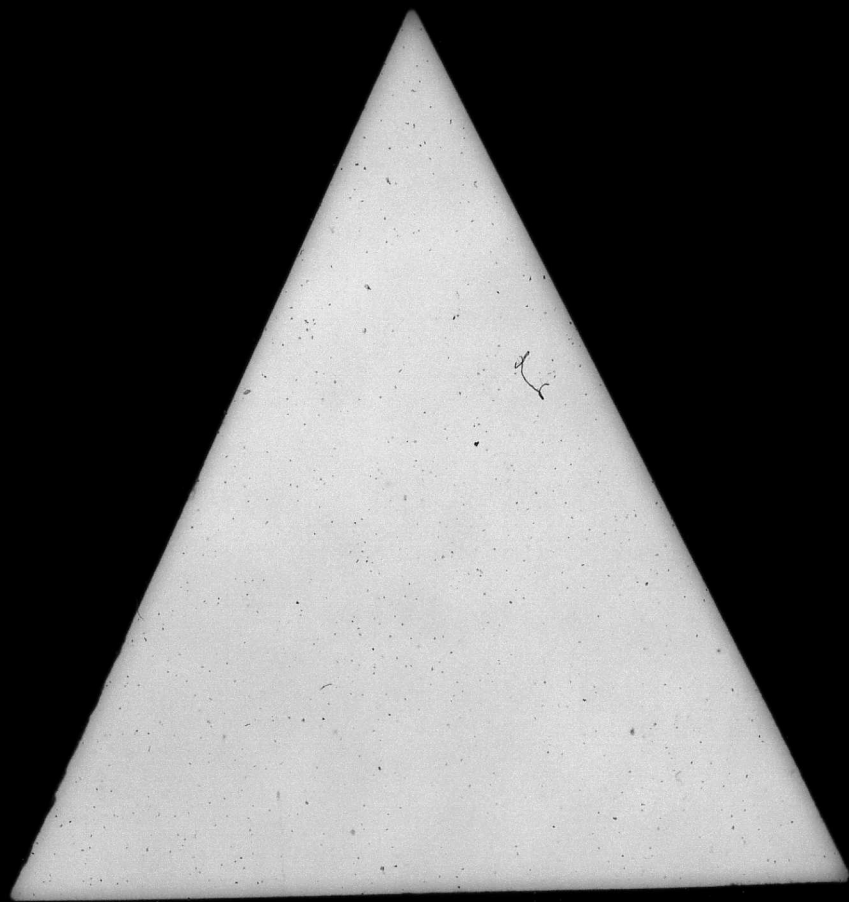

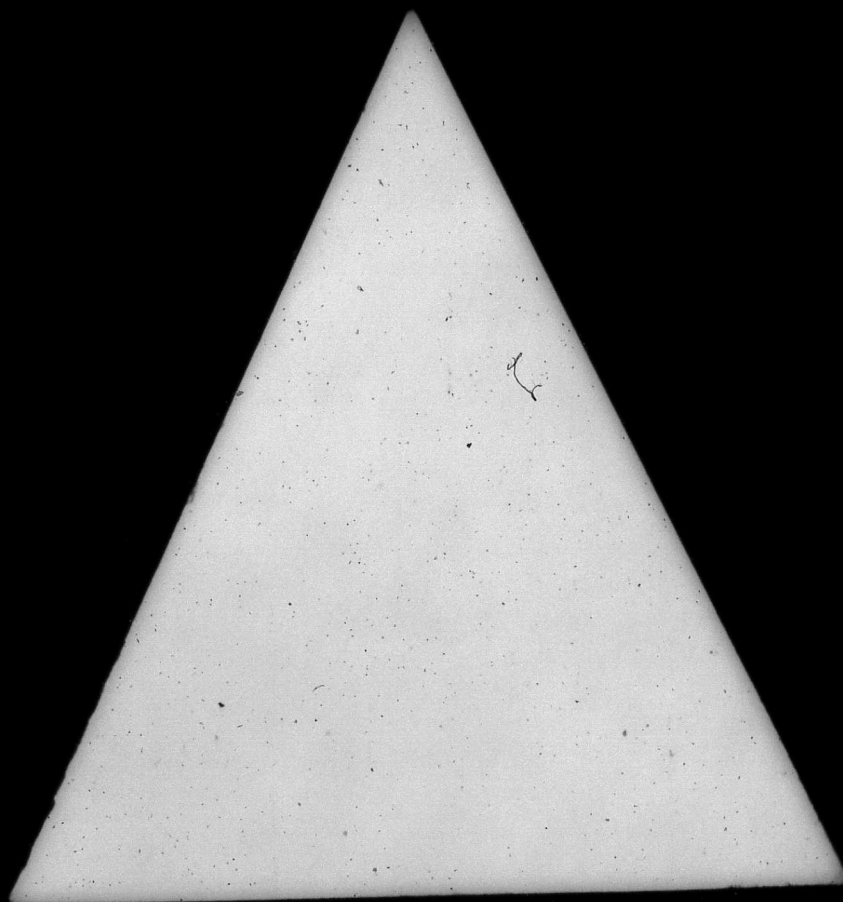

Complying with the 'phone request of Mr. Askew, I am stating the particulars of the death of Mr. John S. Langley, late of this (Campbell) county, and other circumstances and facts as to claims on his pension money, as understood by me, and send app papers connected. I am informed that said deceased fell while leaving dining table, and hit his head against a nail or tack, causing a bad wound which bled very profusely- was at once carried by auto by Mr. H. H. Cook, a near neighbor, to nearest Physician, Dr. T. P. Bullard, of Palmetto, Ga.- that Dr. B., after dressing said wound, requested Dr. W. R. Camp, of this town, to have said deceased transferred to Hospital. But, as deceased had no funds with which to pay Hospital bills, Dr. C. was almost forced to take him, temporarily to Pauper Home, where he was taken care of until his death, Apr. 24, last, after he had been in said P. Home about 10 days. At ^{time} ~~xxxx~~ he received his wound, he was staying with Mr. Will Ray, and was never an inmate of, or regularly admitted to, said P. Home. was carried there in the emergency, to remain until better arrangements could be made. His wife was divorced from him, and he had no home, except as provided by said Mr. Ray- that Mr. Ray had loaned him at least \$25.00, and probably more. - 6th. The completed voucher- this blank and the bills- must be sent to the Pension Department for approval and no money must be paid out until it is returned to you as your authority to make the payment.
- 7th. The Ordinary signs pay roll, as Ordinary, for the pension and then disburses the money himself and takes receipts.
- 8th. Accept no bill for nursing until you write the Pension Department, stating the circumstances in very great detail. Pensioner's children, or dependents, must not charge the State for doing only what the law and common humanity demand of them.
- 9th. Return this application, and attached bills, with your final settlement to the Pension Department.
- 10th. Ordinary should see that the back of this blank, when folded, is filled out.
