and his proof of service has already been made and approved in this Department. The blue blank carries such more information, which is necessary if the husband was not a pencioner. Instructions not to use the white blank in such cases as this one is plainly printed in the caption of the blank.

The proof of fact and date of marriage is setisfactory, but the efficiel record shows nothing except the fact and date of enlistment. The law requires that more than aix months of actual military service shall be stated and proven, and that the soldier be honorably accounted for until the end of the war, and this definiency in the application will have to be remedied.
