APPLICATION FOR SOLDIER'S PENSION UNDER ACT 1910.

Questions for Applicants to Answer.

STATE OF GEORGIA, FULTON COUNTY.

JAMES MARTON GATST of said State and County, hereby applies for the pension provided by Act of 1910, to Confederate Soldiers, and submits his sworn statement, with his testimony to make out the same, and after being duly sworn true answers to make to the questions propounded, answers as follows, to-wit:

 What is your name and where do you reside? (Give County and Post Office)

Ans. James Marion Garst, Forsyth Hotel, Atlanta, Ga.

2. How long and since when have you been a continuous resident citizen of this State?

Ans. My entire life- eighty-one years of age.

- 3. Did you enlist in the Army of the Confederate States.
- Ans. (a) Yes. I first enlisted in the 41st Georgia Regiment, Company "G", at Carrollton, Ga. on March 10, 1862. This date I had forgotten when I made my original application, but my memory has been refreshed by a copy of a letter from the War Department, U.S.A. No. 2130097, of date February 26, 1914, which is hereto attached, and which shows that I was on bounty pay-roll dated March 29, 1862. I remained in service in the 41st Ga. Infantry Company "G", until I was discharged on the last day of May, 1862 on account of sickness.
- (b) I further state that I joined Company "I", loth Ga. Cavalry, State Troops, Confederate States Army, commanded by Col. Floyd, and enlisted en July 28, 1863 at Carrollton, Ga. for six months, and that I remained in service for the term of six months and was absent on leave because of sickness on January 28, 1864. Then making the fermer application I stated that I could not give the date of my enlistment or the date of my discharge, because of lack of memory, but my memory has now been refrashed by reading a

letter from the Adjutant General's office in Washington, hereinbefore referred to, which shows that I enlisted on July 28th, but not giving the year. I remember, however, that it was in the year 1863, and it also states that I enlisted for six months, which I remember to be true. It also states that the roll ocvering a period from September 7, 1863 to January 28, 1864 last on file, shows him, petitioner, absent with leave, which deponent now remembers to be true. Deponent knew at the time that he made the other application that he had served the full six months, but was unable to give the date of enlistment and the date of discharge.

- (c) I enlisted in Beall's Battalion in Carroll County, Ga. in the month of September, 1864, but cannot give the date of the month, as I do not remember it, and have no data with which to refresh my memory, but I continued in Beall's Battalion as a member thereof until the surrender in 1865 and at the time the entire Battalion was discharged.
- 4. When and where, and in what Company and Regiment did you enlist? (Give the arm and class of service).

Ans. I have answered these questions in a, b, and c in the 3rd question, except as to the arm and class of service. In the 43rd Ga., Company "G", I was a private carrying a gun. In Company "I", 10th Ga. Cavalry, State Troops, Confederate States Army, commanded by Colonel Floyd, I was a cook and did not carry arms, except when mustering. In Beall's Battalion I was Orderly Sergeant.

5. How long did you remain in actual military service with said Company and Regiment? Give date of discharge.

Ans. I refer to Question No. 3, paragraphs a, b, and c for the answer to this question.

6. When and where was your Company and Regiment surrendered or discharged from the Service?

Ans. I do not know when or where Company "G", 41st Ga. Infy. was discharged, I having been previously discharged on account of sickness. I was at home sick at the time Company "I", 10th Ga.

Cavalry above referred to was discharged. When Beall's Brigade was discharged at the end of the war in 1865, at Doctortown on the Altamaha River in Georgia, I was in Albany sick at that time, but was

then convalescent and ready to go back to the army when the Battalion was disbanded.

7. Were you actually present with your command when it was surrendered or discharged?

Ans. No, I was exchanged.

8. If you were not present, state specifically and clearly where you were.

Ans. I was in the hospital in Atlanta, Ga. when discharged from the 41st. Ga. I was at my home in Carroll County, Ga., sick, when Company "I", 10th Ga. Cavalry was discharged at Rome, Ga., and when Beall's Brigade was discharged at Doctortown I was in the hospital in Albany, Ga., sick.

(a) Where was your command when you left it?

Ans. At Chattanooga. My command went to Corinth, Miss. and left me at Chattanooga, sick. Company "I", 10th Ga. Cavalry was at Rome, Ga. when I left on sick furlough, and Beall's Battalion was at Doctortown when I left to go to the hospital at Albany, Ga.

(b) When did you leave the Command?

Ans. I cannot answer by giving the exact dates of either of the times when I left my command.

(c) For what cause did you leave?

Ans. On each occasion on account of sickness. My health was bad when I first joined the army and it continued bad during the entire term of the war.

(d) By whose authority did you leave?

Ans. On each occasion I had a furlough from the Commander in Chief, or was sent to the hospitals by the proper officers.

(e) For how long was your leave granted? In what way?

Ans. I do not remember the lenth of time? I suppose it was
during the time I was sick.

(f) Thy did you not return to your command after your leave

Ans. I re-joined when each term of service expired, except when the war closed, and then there was no Willtary Company to join.

(g) In what way were you prevented?

Ans. This has been answered.







The pension is only payable to certain classes of widows.

Those whose husbands were killed in service.

Those whose husbands died in the army of wounds or disease contracted in the service.

Those whose husbands went to the army and have never been heard from since the war.

Those whose husbands were wounded in the army and have since died from the direct effects of the wounds.

Those whose husbands contracted disease in the service, and who after the war, died of the disease caused by the service. The disease directly causing the death.

No widow is entitled unless she was the wife of the soldier during the war, and has never emarried.

The law does not provide for any one living out of the State of Georgia, or who did not live in the State at the date of the Act.

The facts to establish a claim must be substantiated by the testimony of three witnesses who personally knew of the entitlement of the husband and his death and the immediate cause of the death.

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish full and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applicant resides, they must go before
the Ordinary of their County and testify. The attestation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not
answer.

If proofs must be made out of the State, the witnesses must be sworn before a Judge of a Court of Record under seal, and the witnesses must be certified to as reliable, and that their signatures are genuine.

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




