In order to avoid unnecessary delays to applicants, and to enable all parties interested to understand payments provided, the followances to disabled soldiers, as well as the rules adopted by the Governor touching the payments provided, the following suggestions are submitted.

1. It an applicant has been wounded, the description of the wound should be carefully and fully set forth by applicant and physician, and followed by a plain statement of ficts showing the setted of the disability. It applicant claims disability from disease contracted in the service, at all and carefully stated history of the disease should be given, tracing the disability by positive proofs to the service.

2. The law makes so allowance-for an arm or leg, unless the arm or leg has been readered substantially and essentially sucless.


3. It will not answer to say that an arm is "substantially useless for ordinary pursuits of life, etc."

To carry into effect the last clause of Paragraph 1, Section 1, Article 7 of the Constitution of 1877:

SECTION I. He it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Georgia, That any person now a bona fide resident of
this State, who emlisted in the military service of the Confederate States, or of this State, who, while engaged in said military
service, lost a limb or limbs, may furnish to the Governor of this State proof that such applicant has supplied binned; with such
needful artificial limb or limbs, and the Governor, on reception of such proof, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the
Tressurer of this State in favor of such applicant for either amount hereinafter mentioned, to wit: For a leg extending above
the knee, one hundred dollars, for a log not extending above the knee, seventy-five dollars, for an arm extending above the
elbox, sixty dollars, for an arm not extending above the elbox, forty dollars. Provided the said amounts of money may be
allowed to any one entitled to the benefits of this Act who may prefer to supply binned! with the said artificial limb.

Size 11. Be it further enacted by the sald authority. That such application shall contain proof of such applicants being entitled to the benefits of this act, and shall further state whether arm or leg has been supplied. If an arm, whether extending above the elbow or not, if a leg, whether extending above the knee or not, and the Governor shall decide the sufficiency of the proof submitted.

SEC. III. Be it further enacted by the said authority. That no applicant shall receive the sum allowed under this act offener than once in five years.

SEC. IV. Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That all laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

At this place, two companies of State Troops Regiment, composed of Companies commanded by Gaptain W. A. Fuller and Captain James R. Wylie. But just about this time, I was sent on special trains belonging to hhe State of Georgia, to the Southern part of the State to haul provisions for the use of General Johnson and General Hood's armies. I was connected with the State Railroad all the time, but was not mustered or sworn in as a member of Capt. Fuller's Company until Stoneman's Raid at Grisoldville. At this place, we had quite a fight. Then we moved the Rolling Stock of the State's Railroad to Tuscumbia, then called Three and One Half on the Gentral Railroad, including the State's Archives, which had been removed from Milledge-ville, Georgia.

At this place, we drilled every day and was on regular duty, guarding the State's property. In the early fall of 1864, I was sent with ten men in charge of ten cars of the State's Archives to Columbia, S. C. remaining there until the spring of 1885. We were them ordered to Augusta, Georgia, then to Rublodge, Ca, remaining til close of War.

We did military service day and night on and off duty every two hours.

Some months ago I found in the Military Department of the State an original roll of Capt. J. W. Shelton's company of a Railroad Battalion commanded by Major George Hillyer, dated Aug. 27, 1866, Griswoldville, Ga., and find thereon the name of C. L. or C. S. Jones.

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
