WHEREAS, the following original pension applications of Confederate soldiers and widows applying from Georgia appear following on microfilm, I certify that they are true and exact copies of the originals as transferred from the Confederate Pension and Record Division to the Department of Archives and History. chives and History, according to the provisions of Chapter 40-8 of the Code of Georgia.

STATE DIVISION OF CONFEDERATE PENSIONS AND FECORDS ABOLISHED--RECORDS AND DUTIES TRANSFERRED.

No. 625 (House Bill No. 651).

An Act to repeal an Act approved March 24, 1939 (Ga. L. 1939, p. 110), creating a State Division of Confederate Pensions and Records; to transfer the records of the Division to the Department of Archives and History and a procedure connected therewith; to transfer the functions, duties, powers and authority of the Division to the State Department of Veterans Service, and a procedure connected therewith; to provide for the duties of the State Department of Veterans Service in conjunction with said transfer; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

Re it enacted by the General Assembly of Georgia:

Section 1. An Act approved March 24, 1939 (Ga. L. 1939, p. 110), creating a State Division of Confederate Pensions and Records, is hereby repealed in its entirety and the State Division of Confederate Pensions and Records is hereby abolished.

Section 2. The records of the State Division of Confederate Fersions and Records are hereby transferred to the Department of Archives and History. The transfer shall be effectuated in such manner as to preserve the records for historical purposes.

Section 3. The functions, duties, powers and authority of the State Division of Confederate Pensions and Records are hereby transferred to the State Department of Veterans Service. The State Department of Veterans Service shall perform the functions and exercise the powers and duties imposed by law upon the State Division of Confederate Jensions and Records and as may be provided by Jaw.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective as of Pecember 31, 1960_{\circ}

Section t. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Confederate Pension And Record Division

Pension Records

Pension records are filed as they were originally created, beginning in 1879 when the first law for providing for pensions of Georgia Confederate soldiers was passed. Later the law was expanded to accept widows of the Georgia Confederate soldiers to the pension rolls.

There are separate county files (Appling through Worth Counties) and in these county files is listed alphabetically the pensioner's name. One must know the county in Georgia in which the pensioner made his or her application to use to the fullest advantage this group of records. There is no general index to names referring one to the county from which application was made.

NOTES READ CAREFULLY. - In order to avoid unnecessary delays to applicants, and to enable all parties interested to understand the laws granting allowances to disabled soldiers, as well as the rules adopted by the Governor touching the payments provided, the following suggestions are submitted :

If an applicant has been wounded, the description of the wounds should be carefully and fully set forth by applicant and physician, and followed by a plain statement of facts showing the extent of the disability. If applicant claims disability from disease contracted in the service, a full and carefully stated history of the disease should be given, tracing the disability by positive proofs to the service.

2. The law makes no allowance for an arm or leg, unless the arm or leg has been rendered

substantially and essentially useless 3. It will not answer to say that an arm is "substantially useless for ordinary pursuits of There is no qualification to the clause of the Act in reference to the arm or leg, but the limb must for all puposes be "substantially and essentially useless."

4. If the papers are returned for correction and amendments are added to any of the affidavits, the amendments must be made under oath before an officer, and the proofs must show that the amendments have been duly sworn to.

5. Every application must be certified by the Ordinary of the County of the residence of the applicant. The certificate of any other will not be rec ived in any case. The Ordinaries of the several Counties are specially requested to call the attention of

the physicians and applicants to these points. No payments can be made for any past year.

The law does not provide for any one living out of the State of Georgia, or who did not live in the State at the date of the Act.

The facts to establish a claim must be substantiated by the testimony of three witnesses who personally know of the enlistment of the husband and his death and the immediate cause of the death

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawyer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish tull and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applicant resides, they must go before

the Ordinary and testify. The attestation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not answer. Fill out Power of Attorney authorizing some one who can call at Treasurer's office in Atlanta and



No widow is entitled unless she was the wife of the soldier during the war, and has neverremarried.

The law does not provide for any one living out of the State of Georgia, or who did not live in the State at the date of the Act.

The facts to establish a claim must be substantiated by the testimony of three witnesses who personally know of the enliatment of the husband and his death and the immediate cause of the death.

Widows who have married since the service of their husbands in the army are not entitled.

There is no need of employing a lawer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish full and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.
