There is no need of employing a lawer or other agent to attend to these claims. The Department will furnish full and specific instructions, and give ample opportunity to every claimant.

If witnesses live in another County from that wherein applican resides, they must go before the tredinary of their County and testify. The attentation of a Justice of the Peace or Notary will not answer.

It proofs must be unide out of the State, the witnesses must be sworn before a Judge of a Court of a Record under seal, and the witnesses must be certified to as reliable, and that their signatures are genuine?
