Henry H. Allen of Gilmer County, in the State of Georgia has applied to me to identify him as a Soldier in Company E, 29th Regiment, N. C. Volunteers in the Confederate States' service in the war between the States, and as I have not seen Mr. Allen since the war 'til now, it is hard for me to remember his features and identify the man, but as John L. Fish and L. C. Hipps, members of my Company have identified him, and they are both citizens of this county and men of good character, I am fully satisfied he is the identical man that came to my command as a recruit in 1865. I was 1st Lieutenant of Company "E", 29th N. C. Regiment, and at that time was in command of the Company. Was taken sick and sent to the hospital immediately after the fall of Atlanta and was put on the retired list for six months on the account of bad health, and never was with the Command any more after I was sent to the hospital, consequently I know personally nothing concerning Mr. Henry H. Allen's capture etc.

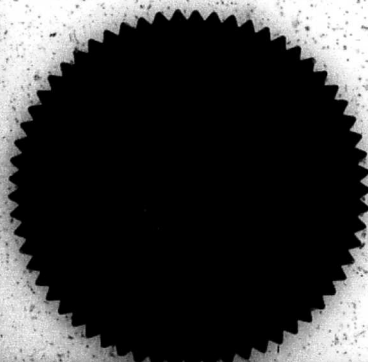
