5. Attach copies of marriage license of both marriages or prove marriage, by some who know it, or by general reputation.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1st. Pay me in full sum where pensioner died after January 1st, 1904, having been out of State longer than twelve months, and did not leave sufficient property to pay such expenses. THE WIDOW OF A SOLDIER, IF SHE IS LIVING, HAS PRIORITY OVER THESE EXPENSES, AND MUST MAKE APPLICATION ON SEPARATE BLANK.

2nd. Retain those retaining expenses of last illness and funeral, to make out their accounts in fully itemized form, giving each item and the amount, and the date of payment.

3rd. Remaining account cannot be paid—only those connected with the last illness, just before death when pensioner grew worse to die. Each account must be sworn to before the Ordinary, and in the following form: "Just, true, due, unpaid."

"The above and foregoing account is rendered for services in the last illness (or for funeral expenses, if the case may be)."

4th. The Ordinary must make it clear made him to render account in every respect, and properly sworn to, and all attached neatly to this blank, when this blank has been paid over to the Ordinary, or to the Pension Department for approval and no money must be paid out until it is so rendered to you or your beneficiary to make this payment.

5th. The Ordinary must pay you or your beneficiary, for the pension and also deserves the money items and labor receipts.

6th. The Ordinary must pay you or your beneficiary, the amount of the pension, and also the expenses of the same, in every respect of them.

7th. Deliver the application, and attached bills, with your final statement, to the Pension Department.

8th. Ordinary should see that the back of this blank, when filled in, is filed out.
