We both came to Gilmer County, and we together with all soldiers north of the Chattahoochee River were ordered to go in under General Wofford. I know that A. J. Cole belonged to Capt. Brown's C. and Edmundson's R. I. and that he surrendered on May 12 1865 at Kingston, Ga.

Personally came before the undersigned
Ordinary B. G. Charles, of said County
who on oath says:

I know A. J. Cole, the
applicant. I know that his affidavit is true
regarding Gen. Hood's order No. 1, and that he
was furloughed under it, and that all soldiers

north of the Chattahoochee river were ordered
to go in the army under Gen. Wofford. A. J.
Cole didn't do, as I also did, A. J. Cole joined
Co. B (Capt. Brown's) Edmundson's Batt. and
remained in it till the close of the war and surrendered
with me under Gen. Wofford May 12, 1865,
at Kingston Ga.

I know of my own knowledge that A. J.
Cole first enlisted in May 12, 1862, in Co. H.
105th Ga., and afterwards served
as above stated by him
and that he never was absent without leave.

To my certain knowledge he had an honorable
leave of absence from his first command and
he obeyed orders in joining his last command.

I was in the same regiment with A. J. Cole in
his first service and in the same Brigade with
him in his last service. We made a good sol-
dier. I know whereof I speak. We enlisted
and surrendered together.

Tennsaw, Gilmer County -

Personally came before the under-
signed Ordinary A. J. Cole, of said
County who on oath says:

I am 70 years
old (next August). As set out in my affidavit
I enlisted in the C. S. Army on May 12, 1862
and served all the time to May 12, 1865, except
while absent on furlough. I never was absent
without leave. In Jan'y 1865, I was furloughed
under General Order No. 1, of Gen. Hood and
came home to Gilmer Co. Ga. This order gave one
soldier a furlough, out of every 15, then and there
present for duty. This gave me an honorable
leave of absence from my command
and I went home direct and was
ordered, with all soldiers ~~to join~~ ^{Confederate} Wofford
then north of the Chattahoochee river to join
Gen. Wofford and I obeyed this order before
my furlough of thirty days expired by joining Capt.
Brown's Co. "B" Edmundson's Batt. which was not
numbered. I also see on the Gilmer Co. Pension
Record & Roll that some of my Comrades are
now drawing a State Pension under the name
of Edmundson's Batt with no number given.
I served in this Batt. till the close of the war and
surrendered at Kingston Ga. May 12, 1865, with Wofford.
I did hard service in this command, being in several
engagements. Col. Tom Polk Edmundson ^{our Commander} was killed
in one of these engagements, close to me. I ~~do not~~
fully submit that the sum stated, ^{and proof} clearly account
for an honorable absence from my first command
and ~~and~~ continued service from enlistment to
the surrender in 1865. I have but one leg now
my blood stained the snow on the battlefield at Franklin Tenn.


