In order to avoid unnecessary delays to applicants, and to enable all parties interested to understand, the law granting allowances to disabled soldiers, as well as the rules adopted by the Governor touching the payments provided, the following suggestions are submitted:

If an applicant has been wounded, the description of the wound should be carefully and fully set forth by applicant and physician, and followed by a plain sistement of facts showing the design of the disease should be given, tracing the disability by positive proofs to the service. It has makes no allowance for a crippled hand, nor for a crippled foot, nor for an arm or leg-his been rendered subtantially and excellable scales.

It will not answer to say that an arm is exablestantially scales for continuous memories of tita as a few to the service.

leg, unless the arm or leg has been rendered sensuament, one exceeding necess.
