STATE OF GEORGIA,

J. P. Hugg of said State and County, having been presented as a witness in support of the application of James C. Lisen for pension under section 1254, Code, and after being duly sworn true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and where do you reside? J. P. Hugg, Appling Co.
2. Are you acquainted with James C. Lisen, the applicant; if so, how long have you known him? Since his life
3. Where does he reside, and how long and since when has he been a resident of this State? Appling County, resident of State all his life
4. When, where and in what company and regiment did he enlist, and how do you know? Sept. 1861, 1st Infantry Company K, 1st Georgia Blue
5. Were you a member of the same company and regiment? Yes
6. How long did he perform regular military duty? about 18 months
7. When and where was his command surrendered? about 1862 at Vicksburg
8. Were you present when it surrendered? Yes
9. Was applicant present? about 1862
10. If he was not present, where was he? about 1862
- When did he leave his command? For what cause?
- By what authority he left? How do you know all of this?

11. What property, effects or income has the applicant? (Give your means of knowledge.) He has no property that I know of
12. What property, effects or income did the applicant possess in 1890, 1897, 1898, 1899, 1900, 1901 and 1902, and what disposition, if any, did he make of same? I don't think he had any property that I know of
13. Has he conveyed away any of his property in the last four years, if so, what was it, and to whom? no
14. What is the applicant's occupation and physical condition? farmer, he has a lame right hand

15. Is the applicant unable to support himself by labor of any sort, if so, why? I don't think he can be because of his lame hand

AFFIDAVIT OF PHYSICIANS.

Personally came before me W. F. Foster and W. H. Reynolds, both known to me as reputable physicians of said County, who, being severally sworn, say on oath that they have examined carefully James C. Lisen, applicant for pension under Section 1254, Code, and after

such personal examination say that his precise physical condition is as follows: applicant has no use of right hand, it has been severely burned in his infancy and is practically useless from disfigurement and pain. He also suffers with neuralgia and rheumatism and a kidney affection. The latter causing him to void urine thick at some times each night with more or less incontinence of same. Applicant is sixty years of age and his age is with other infirmities rendering him unable to do a living, we recommend him as a fit subject for and that we have no interest in said pension being allowed.

Tiller was in the Georgia Militia at Macon, Georgia, and that he served in said Militia for a period of three months or more. Deponent further says that he knows the above facts as stated from his own knowledge, as he was detailed to go to Macon to assist in drilling and organizing the Militia at that place, and that the said James C. Tiller, was, at that time, a member of said Militia and served for the time above stated.

Tiller, who being duly sworn, in addition to the affidavit already made on his regular application for an indigent pension, says that he remained in the camp of instruction at Calhoun, Georgia for a period of three months or more, and that he was honorably discharged from said camp by the board of physicians on account of enfeebled health and lame hands; that he came home from the camp, where he remained for some time, and afterwards re-enlisted at Macon, Ga. in the Georgia Militia. Deponent further says that he was honorably discharged by Capt. John T. Leffon at Yorktown, but that he has lost said discharge. Deponent further says that he was discharged at Yorktown for the same reason that he was discharged from the camp of instruction at Calhoun, Georgia.
