Inquest upon the body of James
P. Pledge held on Sunday October 27th 1878
Said pledge was found on bridge street
on the side walk near the carriage shop
and from the evidence of Doctor
W. B. Hartton and witness Henry Hill
Sworn said that pledge was very
drunk the night before he was found
dead Mr. J. L. Lunkin Sworn that pledge
was lying down where he was when
I first saw him I don't know how
he came there nor I don't know what is
the matter more than he is dead

George Malcomb Sworn said pledge
was lying head where he is now where
I first saw him as I drove up
the street soon this morning since
saw Mr. J. L. Lunkin leading down
and we met at the same place
where Mr. pledge lies only I was
on the carriage and Mr. Lunkin
was walking on the side walk

Beulah Moore being sworn depose and
say that Harrett Whelling was her
mother and that about day she was a
Woke and was praying and glowing
as she usually does also said she left the
house about 7 o'clock that morning and
when she returned she found her mother
dead and that her mother had been
victimized for a long time and she had
been in the habit of taking Laudanum
at night for a long time and had taken
about six drops the night before about
9 o'clock last night and since
passed that she takes no more she is
about sixty years old & Ed Smith
Jr. deposes that from the body and
testimony that the body was murdered and
thinks it highly probable that she was from
paralysis and thinks it not an uncommon
in the persons of her age

After the jury returned and sworn on the Inquest of
Harrett Whelling after hearing the evidence ~~and~~
find that she came to her death paralyzed of the
body.
