ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE
Article III of the Constitution

Section I. Any boy or girl under twenty-one years of age may be eligible for membership in this Society who is lineally descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of American Independence as a soldier, sailor, civil officer, or recognized patriot in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United Colonies or States, *provided* that the applicant be personally acceptable to the Society.

Taken from Cleveland Genealogy, Vol. III, page 2056 to 2072. The Rev. John Cleveland and Lieut. Larkin Cleveland, Capt. Robert Cleveland and Col. Benjamin Cleveland were brothers. All were distinguished soldiers and officers with rank as above stated in the Revolutionary war. The Rev. John Cleveland was the oldest of the brothers and in Vol. III, page 2059 of this Cleveland Genealogy it states that from 1772 to 1785 the Rev. John Cleveland was with his younger brother Lieut. Larkin Cleveland, and Lieut. Larkin Cleveland was under command of his brother Col. Benjamin Cleveland (the great war hero) and was badly wounded on the advance to King's Mountain when one of the decisive battles of the Rev. war was fought. Lucian Lamar Knight's Roster of the Revolution, page 319 gives list of names of men who drew land in Capt. Walton's District in the Lottery of 1825. See C.A.R. Nat.
