

During the first half of the eighteenth century, from 1727 to 1740 many Scotch-Irish Presbyterians residing in the County of Ulster Ireland, came to America seeking religious and civil liberty. They came at various times and in increasing numbers and settled in Pennsylvania, because they had heard that this was a country where they could enjoy both civil and religious freedom. By the year 1740 there were several thousand of these sturdy Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in Pennsylvania, and they were still coming in increasing numbers. Jealousies arose in the minds of the original settlers of Pennsylvania, and restrictive measures were enacted into law by the Proprietary Government of Pennsylvania. These measures were directed at the Scotch-Irish and German immigrants who had settled in Pennsylvania. As a result many of the Scotch-Irish moved and sought homes in the adjoining colony of Virginia. These were generally farmers and mechanics, with a few merchants. There was not a so-called Cavalier among them.

Leaving Pennsylvania they settled in Augusta County, Virginia. At that time Augusta County extended from the Blue Ridge Mountains westward to the Mississippi River. Indians inhabited the most of this territory and the Scotch-Irish immigrants settled in the eastern part of the county in the Shenandoah Valley. The McCleskeys were among these settlers in the valley, and in the records of the Revolutionary War is found the name of James McCleskey who was born in Pennsylvania in 1751, and who later moved to Virginia and married Isabella Rhea. The records show him as a private and wagoner in the Revolutionary War first in Virginia, then in N. Carolina, S. Carolina, and finally in Georgia. He was living in S. Carolina, in Abbeville County on August 2, 1783 when David Henderson McCleskey was born. Later he moved to Jackson County, Georgia and it was here that his wife Isabella Rhea died on January 20, 1803. He died in Hall County on October 20, 1842 at the age of 91. While we have no record of the other children of James McCleskey, we do have an authentic record of his son David Henderson McCleskey.

This record comes through one of his grandchildren, William Columbus McCleskey, son of David Milton McCleskey, who died in Dublin, Texas on January 14, 1928. He had a record of all the children of David Henderson McCleskey. This was from original records left by David Henderson and preserved by his own son David Milton. A son of William Columbus McCleskey is still living in Dublin, Texas. His name is B. M. McCleskey. He is 66 years of age and was eight years of age when his great grandfather, David Henderson McCleskey, died in Marshall County, Alabama, November 29, 1879. He remembers his great great grandfather as his great grandfather for the reason that he never saw his great grandfather, David Milton McCleskey, who died in Gainesville, Georgia, November 1, 1850 at the age of 34. A picture of David Henderson McCleskey is hanging in the home of this B. M. McCleskey and he says that he remembers him quite well.

David Henderson McCleskey was born in Abbeville County, South Carolina, August 2, 1783. He married Martha J. Jarrett of Washington County, Georgia on November 10, 1803. He was Justice of the Interior Court in Jackson County, Georgia in 1815 and held the same office in Hall County from 1841 to 1849. He was a member of the House of Representatives from Hall County in 1838. He evidently lived in Hall County for some time as the Hall County marriage license record shows the marriage of two of his children while living in Hall County, Georgia. In 1852 he moved from Hall County, Georgia to Alabama. His wife, Martha J. Jarrett, died County, Georgia to Alabama. He died November 22, 1879 in Marshall County, Alabama at the age of 36. His second wife was Rebecca Kent or Kemp. They were married on October 20, 1855 at Guntersville, Alabama. He is buried at Bristis Cove Church in Marshall County, Alabama.

David Henderson McCleskey had ten children. Some of these either preceded, followed or accompanied him when he moved from Georgia to Alabama. The names of these children are given on the following pages. None of these are now living, but many of their descendants are living. A great grandchild is living at Bessemer, Alabama. She is Mrs. W. C. Baty. Before her marriage she was Birda McCleskey, daughter of Abner Perry McCleskey. Perry was the son of James Jarrett McCleskey and Anna Dunagan, and was a first cousin of Sameul Rhea McCleskey. A grandchild of David Henderson McCleskey is Mrs. Ella Sampler. She is a daughter of Martha Matilda and lives at Gadsden, Alabama. Many of the younger descendants of Martha Matilda McCleskey are living in North Alabama. One of these, Mrs. Anna Thomason of Albertville, Alabama, was of material assistance in the preparation of this history and I am indebted to her for much of the information concerning our original ancestors. There is much research work yet to be done and the work will be carried forward for another year and during that time we hope to be able to find the names of some of the brothers of David Henderson McCleskey and of their descendants. Next year we shall also include the names of all the grandchildren of David Henderson McCleskey and their descendants of which there are a great many.

The purpose of this effort is to give an accurate account of the family of Sameul Rhea McCleskey, grandson of David Henderson McCleskey, and son of Thadius Henderson McCleskey. Thadius Henderson McCleskey was born in Hall County, April 20, 1806 and Henderson McCleskey was born in Hall County, April 20, 1806 and married Asenith Smith on February 1, 1827. Gideon Morris, hived on the Shallow Ford Road about a mile north of the McCleskey home. The records show that Thadius H. McCleskey was an outstanding citizen. He was Tax Receiver of Cobb County in 1850 and served two

terms. The Tax Digest of Cobb County for the year 1851 shows that he returned for taxation 360 acres of land in the 911 District. Also in the same year he owned five slaves and returned these for taxation. One of these slaves remained in the family after the slaves were freed and is familiarly known to many of the descendants as Troup McCleskey. He lived for many years with M. T. McCleskey (Uncle Polk) and was present at some of the earlier reunions of the family held at the home of Sameul Rhea McCleskey in 1907 and 1908. Asenith Smith McCleskey lived for several years and died at the home of her son, Milton Turk McCleskey in . Both are buried at Holly Springs Cemetery near the original McCleskey Settlement.

Sameul Rhea McCleskey was born November 16, 1827. He married Susan Caroline Babb on February 1, 1849. He lived for a while on the Burton Place. Later he settled at the point where the Shallow Ford Road crosses the Sandy Plains and Trickum Roads and this place later became known as the Sam McCleskey Place. He was living here during the Civil War days and continued to live here until his death. He held many positions of trust and was a member of the Georgia House of Representatives from Cobb County in 1886 -1887. At that time the other representative from Cobb County was Alexander Stephens Clay, later United States Senator from Georgia. Senator Clay attended some of the earlier reunions of the family held at the home of S. R. McCleskey. At one of these reunions Senator Clay made a short talk, a kind of tribute to S. R. McCleskey. The writer remembers distinctly the beginning of this short speech. a quotation from Thomas Jefferson, which ran as follows: "Individuals make families; families make communities; communities make counties; counties make states; states make the Union." Also a question asked by the Senator in this short speech and intended as compliment to the honoree of the occasion is registered indelibly on the mind of the writer. The question was: "Who ever heard of Sam McCleskey being writer. drunk?"

For some reason the reunions were discontinued following the death of S. R. McCleskey in 1912; but in recent years have been revived. Prior to his death the reunions were held at his home. Since that time they have been held; two at the home of his daughter, Mrs. W. G. York; one at the home of his son, Milton Leroy. This year it honors his oldest daughter, Martha Elizabeth (Aunt Bet) by being held at her home near Woodstock, Georgia.

Sameul Rhea McCleskey, his sister Isabella Jane McCleskey (more familiarly known as Aunt Jane Dawson, wife of W. P. Dawson), and his son, Thaddeus Heard McCleskey were all born on November 16. For a long time it was the custom of these three to meet and celebrate their birthdays together. This occasion was always well attended by most of the relatives and after the death of S. R. McCleskey, Aunt Jane and Uncle Thad continued to celebrate the occasion and many are the happy memories cherished in the minds of their closest relatives of these happy occasions.

Aunt Jane died November 6, 1930 and is buried in the Dawson Cemetery near her home by the grave of her husband, W. P. Dawson.

James McCleskey----- was born January 20, 1751 in Pennsylvania and died in Hall County, Georgia, on Oct. 20, 1842. Was married to Isabella Rhea in 1771.
