

Bostick of North Carolina; Jefferson & Richmond Counties

Nathan Bostick was from Surry County, North Carolina, and moved to Richmond County, Georgia. According to the Revolutionary War Pension of John Bostick, an application was made of Hillery B. Bostick (son of Nathaniel) dated in Muscogee County on 31 July 1854, aged 82 years. This application stated that he was a cousin of Captain John Bostick, late of Williamson Conty, Tennessee; that they were boys together in Surry County, North Carolina, although John Bostick was a few years older than Hillery. Hillery's father (Nathan) removed to Georgia, settling in Richmond County, but shortly afterwards, Captain John Bostick came from Surry County, North Carolina on a visit to see his uncle (Hillery's father), when he met a Miss Polly Jarvis in Richmond County, Georgia, to whom John married...it was several years before that Hillery married Elizabeth Jarvis, a relation of Captain Bostick's wife, in the year 1798. Nathan Bostick married Martha. His LWT was dated in Jefferson County on 9 May 1817. He named all of his children specified that his servants, Adam and Milley, were to live with William Hayles. Issue:
