

Campbell of Virginia, Tennessee & Troup County

David Campbell, son of David and Mary (Hamilton) Campbell, was born 1752 in Augusta County, Virginia, died 11 November 1812 in Rhea County, Tennessee. He married 1779/1780, Elizabeth Outlaw, the daughter of Alexander Outlaw (born North Carolina 1738, died in Alabama in 1826). David Campbell served in the American Revolution in Virginia under General Nathaniel Greene, in Rhode Island and in Georgia. He was a Judge of the State of Franklin (now North Carolina) in 1779. Augusta County, Virginia 1803 Judgements, Kennedy vs. McChesney: David Campbell and his wife are about to remove out of the State, 16 October 1802. David Campbell fought in the American Revolution as a Captain in the Virginia Militia, fighting at King's Mountain in October of 1780. Issue:

Campbell of Baldwin County

John Bulow Campbell was born 1828 in Walterboro, Colleton County, South Carolina,

and came to Georgia with his parents, David Crowell and Caroline (Geddes) Campbell. They settled in Milledgeville. He was made war secretary of the executive department of Georgia and served until the close of the war. He later removed to Atlanta, where he served under Governor Jenkins and Governor Smith. He married Margaret Virginia Orme (born Milledgeville), the daughter of Richard McAllister and Jean Moncure (Paine) Orme. John Bulow Campbell died in 1884 in Atlanta. Issue:
