

Causey of Cobb & Jefferson Counties

Ezekiel Causey removed his family from Buncombe County, North Carolina to settle in Jefferson County, Georgia. married Elizabeth Clary. Issue:

Israel Causey was born 1800 in North Carolina, farmer, died 1880, buried in the Community Church Cemetery, near Austell. He married (1) Susan Cowart on 17 April 1817 in Jefferson County, and, (2) Margaret Foyle, 1826 (born 18 in North Carolina, died 1884 Austell, buried Community Church Cemetery). He removed from Jefferson County to Carroll County where he was an overseer of the gold mines at Villa Rica; removed in 1833 to Cobb County, settling Sweetwater Creek. He donated the land on which Causey's Chapel stood, in Austell (later Community Church). Issued by 1st wife:

- V. Patrick H. Causey, born 1833 Georgia, died 7 April 1862, buried Community Church Cemetery, married in 18 Eliza Alexander, the daughter of John Alexander of Louisville, Georgia.
- VI. Mary Agnes Causey, born 1836 Georgia, married in 1853 William Pickens Mitchell, a son of Wiley Mitchell and his wife, Mary Morrow.
- VII. Israel Putnam Causey, born 1838 Georgia, died on 15 August 1862, buried in the Community Church Cemetery during the Civil War.
- VIII. Margaret Causey, born 1840 Cobb County, married James Kerley, the son of William Kerley of Lincolnville, Alabama, in 1861.
- IX. Sarah A. Causey, born 1845 Cobb County.
- X. Frances Causey, born 1847 Cobb County, married in 1869 Richard Henry Cousins, a son of Richard Henry Cousins of Putnam County.

- XII. Frances E. A. Causey married R. M. Perkerson, son of John Samuel Perkerson and Martha Frances Roseberry, 1867.

Phillip Causey was born 16 January 1795 in North Carolina, farmer, died 22 October 1871. He married on 3 September 1822 in Greene County, Sarah T. Laws (born 29 August 1801 in North Carolina, died 29 June 1881. They were listed on the 1850 Randolph County Census. Issue:
