

Long of Elbert & Madison Counties

Samuel Long, Revolutionary War Soldier, was born 1753 in Ireland. He emigrated to Pennsylvania in 1762, served in the Pennsylvania Army, was a Captain under Marquis de LaFayette; was at the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown. He removed to Madison County, Georgia in 1792. His LWT dated 3 July 1822, probated 2 September 1822 in Madison County. He married Ann Williamson, who was born in Ireland.

Book C, page 137. 10 April 1791. Francis Powers and his wife, Elizabeth, deed to Samuel Long of Elbert County, for 50 pounds, 220 acres on Fork Creek on the Broad River, granted to said Powers on 14 August 1786

Book J, page 114. 16 February 1805. Malcom Curry of Elbert County to Thomas Long for \$200, 83-1/2 acres on Fork Creek, www.georgiapioneers.com 10 acres granted to Francis Powers on 14 August 1786, adjoining Gunnells and Miller.
