

Talley of Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina & Newton County

Henry Talley, Revolutionary War Soldier, was born 1760 in Cumberland County, Virginia and died 4 June 1836 in Newton County, Georgia. He married Edith Hubbard on 1 December 1795 in York County, South Carolina. He was a resident of Hanover County when he volunteered for service for one month in Captain Elisha White's Co Colonel Stark's Regiment; enlisted in 1780 as a private in Capt. Crawford's Company, Colonel William Davis' Regiment. He was in the battle of Camden (Gates' defeat) and was discharged on 17 January 1782, having served in all 18 months. Thereafter, he served one month in the Militia as a substitute for his uncle, Jeremiah Lindsey. After war, he moved near Richmond, Virginia, then to Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, and later to Newton County Georgia where he died. The widow, Edith Hubbard Talley, applied for his pension on 30 July 1855 in Newton County, stating that she had married Henry Talley on 1 December 1795 in York District, South Carolina, and later married Francis Hopkins on 10 August 1837, divorcing him on 28 September 1840. Edith Hubbard was born 3 May 1777. Issue:
