

Will of Andrew J. Drane

In the name of God Amen -
 I Andrew J. Drane of said State and
 County being in full health, but of disposing
 mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty
 of human life, deem it right and proper to make
 a disposition of the property with which a
 kind Providence has blessed me, hereby
 revoking and annulling all wills by me
 heretofore made -

1st Item. It is my will and desire that my
 Executor hereinafter named shall pay all
 that I may be due to the firm of S. Epstein & Son
 of Savannah Geo.

2^d Item. I give devise and bequeath to my wife Mary
 Esther Hart (Wife of Dr. E. H. Hart) free from the
 debts liabilities and contracts of her present
 or any former husband all of my stock of
 Cattle and all of my Land except five cows
 with their calves, and twelve acres of Land
 as hereinafter set forth, also all of my
 plantation tools of all kinds.

3^d Item. I give devise and bequeath to Edward Thomas
 Hart, son of Dr. E. H. Hart and said Mary
 Esther (my dau. Old Grace Colt, and a
 prayer which was given me by my father -

4th Item. I give devise and bequeath to my friend
 Isaac Epstein of Savannah Geo. my four
 mule teams, Bessie Cart and all
 appurtenances thereto -

5th Item. I give devise and bequeath to my friend
 Scott L. Pratt of Camden Geo. Col. my Boy
 (Mam (Molly) also all my notes & accounts.

6th Item. I give devise and bequeath to my friend

Dease Epstun of Savannah, Ga. and Scott
 of West of Land County Ga. for the purchase
 of Dolly Durham The intention of
 Dease being part of the money on which
 I now live, (including all improvements
 thereon, also five Cows with their calves
 all my stock of eggs and my household
 and kitchen furniture upon condition
 that Dolly Durham have the use of two
 acres of the planting land thereof for and
 during the lifetime of the said Dolly Durham
 for the use of the said Dolly during her
 natural life and after her death to revert
 back and be disposed of as set forth in the
 second item of this my last Will and testament
 also I give and bequeath to the said
 Dolly one hundred dollars which is to be
 paid her by my executors as soon as
 practicable after my death and it is
 my desire and I hereby wish it upon my
 executors hereafter named that out of
 the funds of my estate they have paid for
 said Dolly or said purchase a small
 piece of comfortable ground -

7th Item I do hereby appoint my trust worthy friend
 Dease Epstun of Savannah, Ga. and
 Scott of Land County Ga. his executor
 for the property conveyed by my said
 2^d Hart in the second item of this my Will
 and also for the property conveyed by my
 said Dolly Durham in sixth item of this my
 Will and the said trustee are
 authorized and requested to see that
 there shall be no waste or injury to

same by the said Dolly or any husband that
 she may have or by any one else -

 Epstun of Savannah, Ga. and Scott of Land County
 Georgia the 1st day of August 1869 my last will
 and testament, This April 16th 1869
