 and Near the river Saluda, Do Make and declare
 this to be My last Will & Testament that is to say
 1st I desire that My funeral Charges and My Just
 and lawful Debts be paid of, and 2^d I do leave
 give and bequeath to My loving ^{Wife} ~~and~~ Nancy
 One Negro Woman Named Fieba, 3^d I do Give and
 bequeath to My Daughter Nancy Ponder One Negro
 Boy Named Nat. I also Give and bequeath to My
 Son Archibald Grayham One Negro Man Named
 Prince Also unto my Son Eben Grayham I do
 Give and bequeath One Negro Woman Named Pat
 Also I do Give and bequeath unto My Daughter
 Rachel Grayham One Negro Woman Named Celia
 Also I do Give & bequeath unto My Daughter Maria
 Grayham One Negro Girl Named Lachey Also
 I do Give and bequeath unto My Son John
 Grayham One Negro boy Named Adria - Also
 I do Give and bequeath to My youngest Daughter
 Named Elizabeth Grayham One Negro Man Called
 and Named Saml. - Also it is My Will and
 Desire that the remaining

Real and personal be equally divided with
and amongst my living wife and Children under
acts and Equale parts & to have & there is certain
Sum of Money due my Estate at all Graham's
and is for the years Edingburgh in Scotland
and New York to the, being due by Peter Campbell
that my wife should, it is also my will and desire
that the same Money or property be equally divided
between & obtained and that same be Equally divided
as above directed. I do Appoint my wife Mary
Mary Jane and John Jackson of the County of Camden
of this my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal
this Seventh day of May in the Year of our Lord
1803.
