

Will of A. M.

State of Georgia
Camden County

I A. M. Peoples, Sr. of the said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and knowing the uncertainty of human life deem it right and proper to make a disposition of the property herein after set forth and described.

1st I give and bequeath to Ellen Peoples, free from the debts, contracts, liabilities or control of any husband that she may have, for and during her natural life and at her death to her lawful children, or the representatives of such children, her surviving, one undivided half of that tract or parcel of land known as the school house, containing forty (40) acres more or less and bounded and described as follows to wit: lying South of a branch which runs from what is called the Gap, running West until about South of the residence of myself and crossing the road emptying into Rose Creek. Which tract or parcel of land is more fully described in a deed of conveyance from Ray Lefkings, dated June 26th A. D. 1872. and recorded in clerk's office Superior Court of Camden County Book, Q. pages 428 and 429.

2nd I give and bequeath to Allison Peoples for and during his natural life, and at his death to his lawful children, or to the representatives of such children, him surviving one undivided half of the tract or parcel of land mentioned and described in the first item of this my Will.

3rd Should either the said Ellen Peoples or Allison Peoples depart this life without lawful children or their representatives

him or her surviving, then the property of the survivor his or her representatives, upon the same conditions as set forth in Bequest 1st and 2nd of this Will.
