

Will of Alexander C. Scott Sr.

State of Georgia
Camden County By the name of Jas. Amos
Alexander Esq. Clerk of said State and
County being sworn and deposing freely and
legally and without the uncertainty of human
life, deposes & gives his oaths to matters and con-
tents of the foregoing which he has seen
has heard and perfectly verifing and confirming
and all evils of one sort or another -
That if any will and desire that all my just
rights be paid as soon as I can be paid for

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I will and desire by my beloved wife Eliza
Scott, all my property, both real and personal,
as, for and during her natural life, with
full authority and power to dispose of any part
or the whole thereof, as she in her judgment
shall deem best for the interest of my estate —
It is my will and desire that at the death
of my said wife (Eliza D.) that all my property
except my stock of clothing shall be equally
divided between my three children, James
C. Scott, Elizabeth C. Scott & Anna Maria
wife of John A. Dolgenau. I have and do
give, I should say give or give to my said
children during their life before they shall
have come into possession of the portion in
which they are to be entitled, then the chil-
dren of such deceased shall in herit-
take in their place and stead,

Will and devise to my son Alexander G. Scott, Jr. Twenty head of stock cattle, say ten cows with their calves, in lieu of two head already given to my son Thomas G.

One twenty have already given to my daughter
July 21. And after said twenty have
shall be set apart to my son Alexander C. the
remainder of my stock of cattle to be equally
divided between my said two sons Thomas E.
and Alexander C.

Thereby appointing my said Helene wife
Elizabeth, Executors, and my said two sons
James & Joseph, and Alexander G. Scott, Jr.
Executors of the said will and testament
Alexander G. Scott, Jr. & Co.

James, Helen and declared
to Alexander C. Scott, Esq. to be
his last will and testament in
the presence of us, who at the special
instance and request of the said
Alexander C. Scott, Esq. have in the
presence of the said Testator, and
in the presence of each other hereunto
subscribed our names as witnesses
to the above recited thereof,
this Twentieth day of August
1858.
