

Will of Mrs Catherine

In the name of God Amen!
Catherine A Berrie said County, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament; revoking all others by me heretofore made. Item 1st I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor hereinafter named, as soon after my decease as may be convenient. Item 2nd I give, devise and bequeath the following described property to wit all my right, title and interest in and to Hickory Bluffs, "Perodantuco", and "Hogay's Bluff" said interest being a Child's part in the estate of my late husband William Berrie in lieu of Dower. Also a tract of Land on the Big Branch, owned by me in my own right; all of said Lands lying and being in Camden County Georgia. And also six large and twelve small Silver Spoons, to Noble A. H. Ross, son of Ananias M. Ross of the City of Savannah in fee simple, forever. And lastly, I nominate, constitute, and appoint Ananias M. Ross Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
