I Catharine Miller of Cumberland Island in
the State of Georgia - do make this my last will and
Testament -

as my much beloved son Nathaniel
Ray Greene has inherited a Considerable estate by the
Will of his honored and Illustrious Father General
Nathaniel Greene, which he can dispose of according
to his own wishes, I am the more desirous that
the property which I intended for him should
descend to his lawful Heirs, I therefore
make this my last will in the following man-
ner - In the first place I do give devise
and bequeath all my plantation on Cumber-
land Island known by the name of Ray
place, together with a number of Negroes -
Orate, Broke, & which shall be hereafter
named to the Lawful Children of my
said Nathaniel Ray Greene, who shall -
however manage the property so bequeathed
to his Children as he shall think fit -
reserving to himself the rents and profits
thereof

170) Therefore for his said wife during her lifetime
and that her last will shall determine what
Proportion each child shall possess of this my
Bequest. I do not positively forbid any sale
or exchange of this property during the lifetime
of my son Nathaniel A. Green. — — —
And I humbly hope that this my Grand-
children may consider this property which
I now give to them as a sacred deposit
in their hands for their Children — but on
case of the death of my son before his Children
become of lawful age, then I appoint my
Executors to take possession of and manage this
property for the use and of these Children —

In the second place I give devise and bequest to the
lawful Children of my son Jonathan Green
Wine Casks and a Silver Tankard together
with half of the Silver Spoons marked A. G.
and thirty Negroes whose names are as follows
with all their future issue. My Sons, Eliza-
betta, Cuffy, Amy, Mary, Phoebe, Dorothy, Sally,
Mary, Warren, Abigail, John, Catherine, Sally, Stephen,
David, Elizabeth, Mary, Mary, David, Ellen,
Agnes, Sarah, Stephen, Maria —

171) And I bequeath half of the Books which belong
to the Household of General Nathaniel Green I
do give devise and bequest to the lawful Chil-
dren of my son Nathaniel A. Green to their
Heirs, Executors and assigns forever —

In the third place I do give devise and
bequest to my beloved and dutiful daughter
Louisa, Catharine Green and to her Heirs, Execu-
tors and assigns forever My Plantation on
Cranford Island called being up by the
same name or by, together with all my House-
hold furniture which I have not already
disposed of, namely the Articles of State and
Union, with one half of the Books which
did belong to her honored father General —
Nathaniel Green, my Carriage and horses
and my Boat called New Parents, with all
my Books which belong to Phineas, Eliza-
beth, his Memorabilia, Picture set in gold and
a first pair of the Hair of General George
Washington which he presented to me. I also
give to my daughter Louisa Catharine
during her lifetime to descend to her Children
if she should have any to succeed her other-
wise it is my will that the above names

As my beloved Stephen Ray, dearest
considers rich and without a family I only
give to him my favorite little Boy Charles as
a testimony of my affection for him.

I also give and bequeath to my
beloved and dutiful niece Rhoda B. Ransom
the one half of my right in an Undivided share
of Land situated on Catfish Creek on the
river by the same name or by to the heirs
Executors and assigns forever. And I also give
her three Negroes, whose names are
and Sack, with one thousand dollars to be

paid her by the angler Louisa Batham, with
Eighteen months after my death.

And it is further my will and I do
heartily give and bequeath to my God
son Phineas Mather Kellsick, and son to my
best beloved friend brother Lemuel Kellsick for
him and his heirs of my portion of an Undivided
share of Land situated on Duck River in the
State of Tennessee to him his heirs and assigns
for ever. And in case (upon the settlement of
Mr. Mather's Estate) there shall be more property
than will pay the debts and a defray the expen-
ces of the settlement of them I do give to my
Beloved God son Phineas Mather Kellsick then
or half of what ever I may yet receive to
him his estate to him his heirs and assigns
forever. And to the same God son I give
a pt. of Pistols, which belonged to my beloved
and ever lamented daughter Phineas Mather Kellsick.

And it is further my will and I heartily
devote my Executors to sell all the rest of my
estate and after paying my debts of them should
remain ten thousand dollars then I command
my Executors to pay to Captain William L. L. of
Rhode Island my only and true beloved
Nephew.

Brother the sum of One Thousand Dollars, and
to my equally beloved daughter Phoebe sister of Black
Solons the same of One Thousand Dollars and all
my remaining appurtenances.

I also give to my grand son Thomas
Nightingale the sum of One Thousand
Dollars, and to my grand daughter Catherine
Nightingale five hundred dollars - to my grand
son Joseph Nightingale four hundred dollars.

And it is further my will that fifteen hundred
dollars be equally divided between my three
other grand children, namely George & Shipwell
John Shipwell and Gray Shipwell.

I also give to my daughter M^{rs}. Martin
W. Sumner of Et Greenwell, and M^{rs}. Corwin
L. Shipwell Littlefield the sum of fifty dollars each.

So I do to Lemuel Littlefield whole and his heirs
I give and I give One Thousand Dollars - and
to my beloved friend Russell Goodrich I give five
hundred dollars as a small testimony of my
affection for him.

The residue of my property of any thing
should be, I give to my son Nathaniel Ray Jr.
Louisa C. Greene and my ever beloved Phoebe
to share and share alike.

And I do give to the said Nathaniel Ray Jr.

March property as I have given in legacies there
it is my will that my estate or rather my property
of the Swamp Lands be sold to the best advantage
and the proceeds divided among my legacies in
the same proportion that I have devised to them
my will - that is to say namely Phoebe and
Thomas all Littlefield - Captain William Littlefield
Phoebe and Phoebe all Nightingale, Joseph Night-
ingale, George & Shipwell & George Shipwell.

I Appoint my beloved daughter Louisa
C. Greene - and my dear friends Lemuel Littlefield
of Savannah and Rufus Goodrich of Augusta
Executors & Trustees investing them with full
power to carry into effect, and I do hereby
enjoin and command that their disagreement
shall decide every thing relating thereto and
it is further my will that no court take
cognizance or interfere with any part of my
property including that of Nathaniel Littlefield.
