

Will of Cornelia, T. Lang

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen
 Chatham County } I Cornelia, T. Lang, at the present-
 time residing in the City of Savannah in the County
 and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing
 mind and memory do make and publish and
 declare this my last will and testament hereby
 revoking and making null and void any and
 heretofore made by me.

Item First

I hereby direct that all my just debts be
 paid as soon as practicable after my death
 out of the income of my Estate if possible;
 and if not then by the sale of my property
 in Camden County, and if that be insufficient
 then by the sale of my Railroad Stocks and
 other Securities

Item Second

I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter
 Mary Louisa Lang all my undivided one
 half interest in Lot number four Gekyl
 tything, Derby Ward in the City of Savannah
 with the improvements and appurtenances to
 have and to hold the same unto her so long
 as she shall remain unmarried, and to have
 and receive the net rents and profits thereof
 to her sole and separate use and behoof
 and from and after her marriage, I give
 devise and bequeath the said undivided
 half interest in said lot of land and
 appurtenances unto my said four children
 to be equally divided between them, share
 and share alike as tenants in common to
 them and their heirs and assigns forever

And in the event that my said daughter Mary Louisa shall never marry then I devise and direct that she shall have the power of disposition by deed or will of an undivided one fourth of my said interest in said lot of land, and she shall be entitled to receive the rents income, and profits of the whole of said undivided interest in said lot of land so long as she shall remain single.

Item Third

I devise and direct that my said undivided interest in said lot number Four forty eight, Early Wood, shall not be sold or disposed of during the life time of my sister Mary Supper unless she shall desire to have the entire lot sold or to sell fully and voluntarily consent to such sale and in the event that said lot shall be sold before the marriage of my said daughter Mary Louisa Long, I direct that then half or share of the proceeds belonging to my lot shall be invested in other property real or personal by my Executors, and that the income and profits arising from such reinvestment shall be received and enjoyed by my said daughter as long as she shall continue and remain single, in the same manner as the rents of the said undivided interest in said lot shall have been received and enjoyed by her, and at her marriage the said reinvestment shall be divided among my said children as hereinbefore provided for the division of my said undivided interest in the said lot.

Item Fourth

I give and bequeath unto my said daughter all my real and personal estate and direct that no inventory be taken of these articles, but that my said daughter may take possession of the same immediately on my decease.

Item Fifth

All the real and residue of my property and estate both real and personal of which I may be seized and possessed, or to which I may be ever entitled I give devise and bequeath unto my four children to be equally divided between them share and share alike, as tenants in common, to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

Item Sixth

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved sister Mary Supper the Executor of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby authorize and empower my said Executor, reposing special trust and confidence in her, to sell either at public or private sale any part or the whole of my property real and personal whenever in her discretion such sale may be necessary or beneficial to my estate, or for the purpose of division among the devise and legatees or for reinvestment, the power of sale is personal to my said Executor, and may not be exercised by any successor in the administration except under the order and sanction of a court of competent jurisdiction.
