The last Will and Testament of Daniel Stanes
of Camden County Georgia I Daniel Stanes
Considering the Uncertainty of this Mortal
life and being of sound mind and memory do
make and publish this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following
That is to say — I

do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Ann Stanes all my property whether real
or personal after the payment of my last
debts or as soon as possible I wish her to have
the privilege of selling my Negro
Woman Fanny —

and I hereby appoint my wife Ann
Stanes sole executrix to this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all former
Wills by me made in Writing Whence
I shew unto all my Land and Seal this
Tenth day of July in the Year of our
Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred &
