child becomes of age she to give
each child the sum of fifty (\$50.00)
dollars the remainder to be solely the
property of my wife
and I do hereby appoint - my beloved
wife Leah Rose Executor of this my
will and sole Guardian of my children
she to qualify as such without
an accounting or being required to
give bond in testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand this 3rd day
