I Elisha Holladay of the Town of Saint Marys in
the State of said County of Camden Master Mariner
being sick and weak in Body but of sound and
disposing Mind Memory and Understanding, promise
be god for the same, do make and declare this my
last will and Testament in manner & form following;

I will that after all Expenses for my sickness
and burial, and all other bills that I may owe
shall have been paid, the remainder of my property
shall be divided Equally between my two sons
Malathia Hoda Holladay, and John Holladay,
It is further my will and desire that my part of
the stock two Sisters, Consisting in the One half of
the said Stock, shall remain under the direction
of my Friend John Holladay, Until the balance
of a certain Note due by me to Francis Young
of the Town of Saint Marys, shall have been fully
paid to him by people coming out of my said
half of the said Stock two Sisters. Whereof my
said Friend John Holladay will give due account
unto my Executors, - It is further my
wish that the two Negro Slaves Fanny & John
the property of my said Children Malathia
Hoday and John, should during the minority
of my said Children be raised as follows
that is to say, that the Negro Slave John
should be under the care of my Friend
William King, having charge of said John
and that the Negro Slave Fanny should be

sent to my Friend John James Esq at San Steben
near Camplittan in south Carolina, having
particular charge of my said Malathia Hoday
and I do hereby Recommend consistent apperant
my said Friend William King of the County of
Camden, and my said Friend John James Esq
of above shewing near Camplittan in the State
of South Carolina the Guardians of my said
Children Malathia Hoday and John, and
the Executors of this my last will & Testament
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this twenty first day of May
in the Year of our Lord One thousand Eight
Hundred and six, and in the Thirtieth Year
of American Independence. -
