6 head of Stock Cattle namely eight year
Shore and smooth coat Brown M and
seventy five acres of Land lying in Camden
County once be land of John Wilkerson on
the North by land of John Blane on the
East by land of John Blane on the South and
by land of Henry Jenkins on the West
and I also authorize Nancy White and
Sam Minor to be guardian over the said
Property for the said Joe Minor

Item 9 I do hereby appoint Nancy White and Sam
Minor Executors of this my will As to
compensation for his services over the
sum of \$1000 to be taken from the said
funds
