 his natural life & at his death to go to and be
 divided among all and every of my Children
 now living or living at the death of my Husband
 Death to be divided between Thomas Mearns & three
 alike & in ~~any~~ case of the death of any of our
 Children ~~living~~ I leave them such share of Estate
 among them proportionally the share or proportion
 had or either of them had such share to be
 living would have had & if such deceased have
 but one Child then that Child to take the
 parents full share or proportion. —

And lastly I do nominate & appoint my trusty
 & well beloved Husband Edward Mearnsman James
 Johnston & Richard M. Miles of Savannah City
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament
 hereby revoking all former and other Wills of
