I the subscribed Cesar Francis Maysault
fifty two years of age a Male of Angers the
Capitol of Laugon in the Parist St. Michael
of Jertor, Legitimate son of Leonard Maysault
and Anne Trouillet my Parents; - Fearing
to be surprized by death, Make the present
Testament as followeth, for to be Executed acor-
ding to its form and tenor it being my own
Will - I Appoint Mr. William Gibert of
Saint Marys, Merchant my Executor and
Administrator for the above purpose. -

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beds, closets, table chairs, apparatus
and belonging to Suzanne Duval.

All my property in Negroes hath been
transported to my sister in Law by whom
they were mortgaged in number of Mounts
to Mr. Theodore Galliard; nine thereof have
been sold for to pay him and the others
eight in number have been returned to -
Anne Mangate Inna. Mr. Muffs and to
my sister in Law; they are, Sagon, Suben,
Magdelon, Perrine, with their children
and the Negro Appollon as well as Lulu
who both are in Charleston - These Negroes
have been delivered to her for the purpose
of being returned to me after my debt were
paid.

I recommend to Mr. William Gibson that
the Negro wench Perrine and her daughter
Suzon, may be received for Suzanne Duval
having come to Savannah in Georgia, and by
her Industry hath really deserved the said
Negro wench Perrine and her daughter - I am
all the remainder of my property is to pay
my debts, and to go to my Native Land.
